

**IDCH Dual/Joint Enrollment Programs**

7/20/17

It is the policy of the Board of Education to allow eligible students to take approved courses from postsecondary institutions while still enrolled as high school students and receive credit at the high school and/or at the postsecondary institution, in accordance with the requirements of State Board Rule 160-4-2-.34 Dual Enrollment – Move On When Ready and O.C.G.A. § 20-2-161.3.

The Superintendent and appropriate staff shall develop procedures on dual and joint enrollment programs to ensure that:

1. Information is provided to students concerning the opportunity of dual and joint enrollment programs as part of the development of their plan of study. By February 1 of each school year or prior to enrollment in an eligible institution, appropriate high school staff shall provide general information about all dual enrollment programs to all eligible students.
2. Program information and materials are provided to each eighth grade student at the time the student is developing his/her individual graduation plan as required by O.C.G.A. § 20-2-327.
3. For any student who indicates an interest, appropriate high school staff shall provide advisement information to the student and parent(s) or guardian(s), including information related to extra quality points as outlined in Administrative Rule IDCH-R, before the student enrolls in the program.
4. Prior to participating in the program, the student and the student's parent or guardian shall sign the form provided by the eligible high school or by an eligible postsecondary institution stating that they have received the counseling specified and that they understand the responsibilities and possible consequences that shall be assumed in participating in the program.
