Cobb 11th Graders Score High Marks On Writing Test Key subgroups show greatest improvement

Cobb County 11th graders increased their average scale score by four points over last year on the 2008 Georgia High School Graduation Test (GHSWT), easily outperforming their peers in metro Atlanta and across the state. In addition, 95 percent of the 7,300 Cobb County students who took the test either met or exceeded standards. Perhaps most significantly, two key subgroups – Students With Disabilities (SWD) and English Language Learners (ELL) – showed remarkable improvement.

The test, which gauges writing skills considered essential for a high school diploma, was administered in early September 2008, with Cobb students attaining an average scale score of 225, two points higher than the average of metro area schools, and four points higher than the state average. The scale used to measure achievement ranges from 100 to 350, with a score of 200 as "meets expectations," and 250 as "exceeds expectations" (See Table I).

Cobb County's population of English Language Learners (ELL) and Students with Disabilities (SWD) performed particularly well on the writing test. Seventy-five percent of ELL students tested in Cobb County met or exceeded expectations, compared to just 65 percent across the state. In Cobb, the meeting and exceeding percentage for ELL students jumped a substantial 20 percent over last year. Meanwhile, the percentage of Cobb County Students with Disabilities meeting or exceeding expectations increased to 80 percent, up eight percentage points over last year and well above the state average of just 60 percent (see Table III). The performance of subgroups across Cobb County has been an ongoing concern, as well as a primary focus of the district's coordinated plan to make Adequate Yearly Progress under the No Child Left Behind Act.

Individual schools across the district also fared well on the 2008 writing test. At 15 of the district's 17 high schools, 90 percent or more of the students met or exceeded expectations. Four district high schools – Hillgrove, Lassiter, Pope and Wheeler – led all others with 99 percent of students scoring at or above expectations, and Harrison and Walton students were close behind with 98 percent meeting or exceeding expectations (see Table I).

A passing score on the High School Graduation Test is one requirement for all students pursuing a high school diploma. The writing portion of the test was administered in September to Cobb County 11th grade November 12, 2008

students who were required to write a persuasive paper on an assigned topic. The GHSWT is two hours in length, with 100 minutes of student writing time.

The GPS domains, or broad themes, covered by the writing test include *Ideas*, *Organization*, *Style*, *and Convention*. The *Ideas* domain measures the degree to which the writer establishes a controlling idea and elaborates the main points with examples, illustrations, facts or details. In the *Organization* domain, students are assessed on their ability to arrange ideas in a clear order consistent with the persuasive genre. *Style* points are awarded based on the writer's ability to control language and engage the reader. The *Conventions* domain measures the degree to which the writer demonstrates control of sentence formation, usage, and mechanics. Test scores are ranked on a scale of 1 to 5, where 1 is the lowest and 5 is the highest. In each domain, Cobb 11th graders scored higher than their peers across the state (see Table II). Seven of the high schools across the district had domain scores that were consistently higher than averages for the district, metro area and state (see Table II).

"The writing test represents a critical skill for all students, so these results for Cobb County 11th graders are very encouraging," said Robert Benson, Assistant Superintendent of Curriculum and Instruction for the District. "These improved scores likely are a reflection of the increased rigor we have worked into the curriculum. We are particularly pleased to see that the scores for our Students With Disabilities and English Language Learners showed such strong improvement."

In March, high school juniors will be tested on language arts, mathematics, social studies, and science portions of the Georgia High School Graduation Test (GHSGT). Students will have multiple opportunities to retake any portion(s) of the test they fail before graduation.
