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Cobb Students Excel on Graduation Test

Scores Improve in Three of Four Subjects; New Math Test Results Strong

Cobb County 11th grade students outperformed their peers on all four portions of the Georgia High School Graduation Test (GHSGT), and scores improved in three of the four subject areas.

District scores in English/Language Arts (247) were 10 points higher than the state (237) and seven points higher than a comparison group of 10 metro Atlanta school districts. In Math, Cobb students scored 252, 16 points higher than the state (236) and 12 points higher than the comparison group. In Science, Cobb scores topped state scores by eight points (Cobb 251, state 243) and outperformed the comparison group by six points. In Social Studies, Cobb students scored 251, 14 points higher than the state score of 237 and eight points higher than the comparison group score of 243 (*See Table I*).

Cobb's first time 11th grade test takers had a pass rate of at least 90 percent in three of the four subject areas tested. In both English/Language Arts and Science, Cobb's average district-wide pass rate was 96 percent. Perhaps even more impressive, though, was the district's performance on the new Math test. For the first time, the Math portion of the GHSGT was based on the Georgia Performance Standards rather than the older Quality Core Curriculum (QCC) standards. Math was the last subject to convert to GPS. Any time a new test is implemented state-wide, the common expectation is that scores will drop in the first year. Indeed, the state's average pass rate in Math dropped seven points, and the metro Atlanta comparison group's average pass rate dropped eight points. But in Cobb, the average Math pass rate dropped just one point and remains at a very high level of 93 percent passing.

Science scores showed consistent gains over a five-year period for all student subgroups, with most notable gains by Native American students (41 percent) and Hispanic students (36 percent). Scores for students qualifying as English Language Learners increased 34 percent over the same five-year period, and Special Education students had a gain of 33 percent over five years in Science.

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The percentage of students scoring in the Advanced Proficiency or Honors levels on the exams is a good indicator that Cobb students are performing well on the more rigorous Georgia Performance Standards. In order to reach these higher levels of performance, students must attain a score that is higher than the minimum scale score needed to simply pass each exam and earn a diploma. In English/Language Arts, 70 percent of Cobb students reached these higher levels; in Math, 67 percent; in Science, 71 percent; and in Social Studies, 56 percent attained them (*see Table II*).

"We are very pleased with the results of the Georgia High School Graduation Test," said Superintendent Fred Sanderson. "Cobb students continue to distinguish themselves as high performers, and this year's results are very strong. I am especially pleased with the performance on the new Math test. A 93-percent pass rate is outstanding under any circumstance, but to achieve that result on a new test is just tremendous. It speaks to the diligent work of our teachers who got ahead of the new Math implementation and began preparing our students before many others did. Thanks to their efforts, the new standards have been in place in Cobb for some time, and the teachers have been able to focus their attention on the progress of individual students."

Several Cobb schools reached a remarkable milestone with 100 percent of their students meeting or exceeding standards. These include Allatoona High School (English/Language Arts), Pope High School (Mathematics) and Walton High School (Science). Allatoona, Kennesaw Mountain, and Walton high schools were not far behind with 99 percent also passing math (*see Table I*). At Walton, 80 percent or more reached Advanced Proficiency or Honors level on all four subject tests, closely followed by Lassiter and Pope with at least 75 percent reaching the higher levels of achievement. (*See Table II*).

Schools use the GHSGT results to determine if students are well-prepared students to graduate and earn a high school diploma. Students who do not succeed on their first attempt have additional opportunities to meet the standards prior to completing 12th grade.

As part of the statewide testing program, 11th grade students are administered the GHSGT each spring. They are tested in four subject areas — English Language Arts, Mathematics, Science and Social Studies — and each section must be passed to earn a Georgia high school diploma. Scores range from 100 to 300 with 200 as a passing score in English Language Arts, Science and Social Studies. The scores for Math range from 400 to 600, with 500 as passing. Results for the system, state, metro area (RESA– Regional Educational Service Agencies) and individual schools are listed in Table I. Tables IIIA - IIID provide program summary data for each content area tested.

COBB COUNTY SCHOOL DISTRICT TESTING BRIEF

Georgia High School Graduation Tests Spring 2011

(English Language Arts, Mathematics, Science, and Social Studies)

Georgia law (O.C.G.A. §20-2-281 G, (a) mandates that a "curriculum-based assessment be administered in grade 11 for graduation purposes" and (c) "that the State Board of Education shall have the authority to condition the awarding of a high school diploma to a student upon achievement of satisfactory scores on instruments or tests adopted and administered by the State board pursuant to (a) of this code." The law further provides opportunities for students with disabilities "to take any test adopted by the State Board as a condition for awarding of a high school diploma" and to receive accommodations specified in their IEP as necessary for participation.

The Georgia High School Graduation Tests (GHSGT) assess only a sample of the knowledge and skills that educators agree comprise a complete high school education. Georgia students have opportunities to learn – and are expected to master – much more than the tests address. The state adopted curriculum is the source of the knowledge and skills assessed on the graduation tests.

Students take the GHSGT for the first time in the spring of the 11th grade. Schools use the results to identify students who need additional instruction in the academic content determined by Georgia educators as necessary for a high school diploma. Students who do not succeed on their first attempt have four additional opportunities to meet the standards prior to completing 12th grade.

Tests based on the Georgia Performance Standards (GPS) were administered in English Language Arts, Math, Science and Social Studies to grade 11 first-time test takers in the Spring 2011 Administration.

At the district level, the percentage of Regular Program students passing the English Language Arts test increased from 96% last year, to 97% this year. Eighty (80) percent of Special Education students scored at or above the expected level of proficiency, compared to 71% percent in the prior school year. Similarly, English Language Learners tested increased from 60% passing to 67% in the current school year.

On the Math portion of the Graduation Test, the percentage of Regular Program students passing dropped two percentage points to 94% from 96% last year, while the percentage of Special Education students passing increased six percentage points from 73% during the 2010 school year, to 79% this year. English Language Learners passing the test declined from 79% last year, to 66% this year.

On the Science test, the percentage of Regular Program students at or above basic proficiency was 97%, up from 93% last year. Similarly, 85% of Special Education students passed, compared to 71% last year, and 73% of English Language Learners passed, up from 63% last year.

There were notable gains in Social Studies percentages, with 90% of Regular Program students passing compared to 86% in 2010, from 56% to 63% this year for Special Education students (an increase of 7%), and from 41% to 45% (a gain of 4%) for English Language Learners.

KEY FINDINGS

ENGLISH LANGUAGE ARTS

- A total of 5,979 Regular Program Grade 11 First-time Test Takers took the ELA test. Ninety-seven (97) percent met the passing standard with a mean scale score of 249. This is higher than the previous year's scale score of 248.
- A total of 400 Special Education Grade 11 First-time Test Takers took the ELA test. Eighty (80) percent met the
 passing standard with a mean scale score of 220. The percent of Special Education students passing in 2010 was
 71%, with a scale score of 216.
- A total of 98 English Language Learner Grade 11 First-time Test Takers took the ELA test. Sixty-seven (67) percent met the passing standard with a mean scale score of 207. Last year, sixty (60) of the English language learners met the passing standard with a scale score of 205.

MATHEMATICS

- O A total of 5,856 Regular Program Grade 11 First-time Test Takers took the Mathematics test. Ninety-four (94) percent met the passing standard with a mean scale score of 253. Due to the change in standards for Math from QCC to GPS, this scale score is not comparable to the scale score for last year. The percentage of students passing the Math assessment (94%) is lower than last year's 96%.
- A total of 358 Special Education Grade 11 First-time Test Takers took the Mathematics test. Seventy-nine (79) percent met the passing standard with a mean scale score of 224. The percentage of students passing the test increased six percent from 73%.
- A total of 82 English Language Learner Grade 11 First-time Test Takers took the Mathematics test. Sixty-six (66) percent met the passing standard with a mean scale score of 219. The percentage of students passing decreased by thirteen percentage points (from 79%) in 2010.
- Due to the shift in standards tested from QCC to GPS, scale scores cannot be compared from 2010 to 2011.

SCIENCE

- O A total 5,962 of Regular Program Grade 11 First-time Test Takers took the Science test. Ninty-seven (97) percent met the passing standard with a mean scale score of 253. The average scale score for 2010 was 244.
- A total of 400 Special Education Grade 11 First-time Test Takers took the Science test. Eighty-five (85) percent met the passing standard with a mean scale score of 226. This reflects a higher pass rate than the 71% of students meeting expectations in 2010.
- A total of 98 English Language Learner Grade 11 First-time Test Takers took the Science test. Seventy-three (73) percent met the passing standard with a mean scale score of 214. The average scale score for 2011 is 4 points higher than last year at 210, and the number of students meeting standards is 10 points higher than last year's 63%.

SOCIAL STUDIES

- A total of 5,960 Regular Program Grade 11 First-time Test Takers took the Social Studies test. Ninety (90)
 percent met the passing standard with a mean scale score of 254. The percentage of students passing increased
 by 4 percentage points from the previous year at 86%.
- A total of 399 Special Education Grade 11 First-time Test Takers took the Social Studies test. Sixty-three (63%)
 percent met the passing standard with a mean scale score of 219. The percentage of students passing increased
 by 7 percentage points from the previous year at 56%.
- A total of 98 English Language Learner Grade 11 First-time Test Takers took the Social Studies test. Forty-five (45) percent met the passing standard with a mean scale score of 202. The percentage of students passing increased 4% from last year's 41%.

Percent Grade 11 First-time Test Takers Passing GHSGT English Language Arts, Spring Administration 2006-2010



Percent Grade 11 First-time Test Takers Passing GHSGT Mathematics, Spring Administration 2007 - 2011



Percent Grade 11 First-time Test Takers Passing GHSGT Science, Spring Administration 2007 - 2011



Percent Grade 11 First-time Test Takers Passing GHSGT Social Studies, Spring Administration 2007- 2011


