Digital Learning Days

CTLS has improved how Cobb students learn and how teachers teach. During the 2024-2025 school year, CCSD has designated Digital Learning Days (previously Asynchronous Learning Days) to allow teachers the chance to participate in professional learning. On these days, students will learn at home through CTLS and not report to Keheley.

OVERVIEW

On Digital Learning Days, you can expect the following:

- Students will work from home, through CTLS, on teacher assigned choice boards and other posted activities within their Digital Classrooms.
- Teachers will have reviewed expectations with students prior.
- Teachers will <u>not</u> host live, face-to-face instruction on these days.
- Students will post work in CTLS or bring assignments into the school the following day.

DAILY ASSIGNMENT EXPECTATIONS

All Grades K-5 will have 30-minute assignments, that students should be able to complete independently, posted in CTLS in each of the following subjects:

- Reading/Writing
- Science or Social Studies
- Math
- · Specials (select one specials)

TIPS FOR SUCCESS

- Make sure your student has access to CTLS.
- Elementary students can expect around 2 hours of total work per day that can be completed at their own pace and schedule.

REQUIREMENTS

All work will be housed in CTLS and will be published for student access by 8:00 a.m. on the Digital Learning Day.

SPECIALS SCHEDULE

Each of our special teachers will post activities in their digital classrooms. Students are encouraged to login to the specials of their choosing to complete activities.

TARGET

If your child is scheduled for Target on a day that is declared a Digital Learning Day, he or she should log into his/her Target teacher's class in CTLS. The Target teacher will post assignments on the class board in CTLS.

FERQUENT CONCERNS

- Communicate any issues or concerns with your child's teacher.
- Try your best to complete tasks, but do not worry if all items cannot be completed.
- Do not stress over assignment, device, or Internet issues.
