# Registration for new kindergarten and first-grade students is currently underway online for the 2024-2025 school year. Don't delay!

Keheley has upcoming April, May and July events for kindergarten students that are fully enrolled!

The online student registration, which is the same system used for all students new to the Cobb County School District, enables the enrolling adult to register all students in their family at once. The safe and secure system allows parents to enter information, save it, and return later to complete the registration.

Enrolling adults who already have a current Cobb student will need to use their ParentVue account to register additional new students.

## Safety Reminders

Each day, the safety of our students, staff, and parents is our priority. While we understand waiting can be difficult, please realize that keeping everyone on campus safe is more important than the few extra seconds gained by not following our procedures. Recently, we have had cars run over cones, cars passing stopped cars and narrowly missing children unloading on the left side of the car, and driving up the wrong side of the parking lot. It is of the utmost importance you follow our traffic protocols each day.

Please remember to adhere to our simple and safe carpool rules:


- **1. Students load and unload on the right hand side only.** This prevents the risk of being hit by a passing car that is not following protocol. Also, staff cannot see around cars to the otherside.
- 2. Drivers wait until cars move, not not go around cars that are still loading. This prevents the risk of running into other cars, people, and cones.
- **3. Follow the directives of our staff working carpool.** Our staff is well trained on when to stop cars and help pedestrians cross the walk.
- 4. Pull all the way forward to the end of the loop and to the car in front of you to allow for the maximum amount of cars in the parking lot at a time.
- 5. Be respectful to all.

# Tech Tip

### **Technology Boundaries**

During the tween years, ages 8 to 12, children start exploring more on their own, but that doesn't mean you don't want or need to be close at hand. It's important to be nearby when your tween is online. For this age group, consider keeping the computer in an area where the child has access to you or another adult. That way, they can be "independent," but not alone. Unsupervised online time increases risks and challenges for tweens. These include exposure to inappropriate content, cyberbullying, privacy concerns, and potential negative effects on mental health and well-being. It's essential for parents and guardians to be actively involved, set boundaries, and foster open communication to ensure their child's online safety and well-being.


