- 2) School Counseling Updates
  - a) Sister and Dr. Lance: **Therapy dog Sister and her handler, Dr. Lance, CCSD Social worker along with Paul Pursell, Keheley's social worker is working with a group of 4<sup>th</sup> grade students in a Leadership Group for 6 weeks. - 3) SPLOST Funding Updates
  - a) What is Ed-SPLOST? **Education Special Purpose Local Option Sales Tax**, is a one-cent sales tax that local school districts in Georgia can use to fund capital improvements and long-term debt reduction. It is a consumption tax, meaning it applies to all purchases made within the district, and it cannot be used for operating expenses or salaries. The funds from Ed-SPLOST are used specifically for educational purposes, including the construction of new schools, renovations, and technology upgrades.
  - b) Construction: **Meeting with team monthly in preparation for building updates. Some construction will occur on breaks and/or after school hours. Team walked the building on MLK Jr. to finalize plans. Interior and exterior painting will occur in the summer months. Other projects included in SPLOST new roof, new bus put covered walkway, all restrooms updated, window and door replacement as needed.**
  - c) Technology: **All new panels for classrooms the week of Feb. 9. Crew working after hours and at night.**

  - a) What is school climate? **School climate is a broad term that describes the quality of school life by measuring student and adult (families, teachers, and staff) experiences related to academics, relationships, safety, and the physical environment.**
