Writing Standards




- Students must use a combination of drawing, writing, and dictating to create different types of writing.
- Informational (to teach about a topic), narrative (to tell a story), and opinion (to share what they think about something).
- They will use phonetic spelling to write words, and use details in their pictures to convey their stories.
- They will use simple sentences that will use grade level sight words.
- Example: I like to go to the park.

- Number sense (Recognizing numbers shown in different ways)

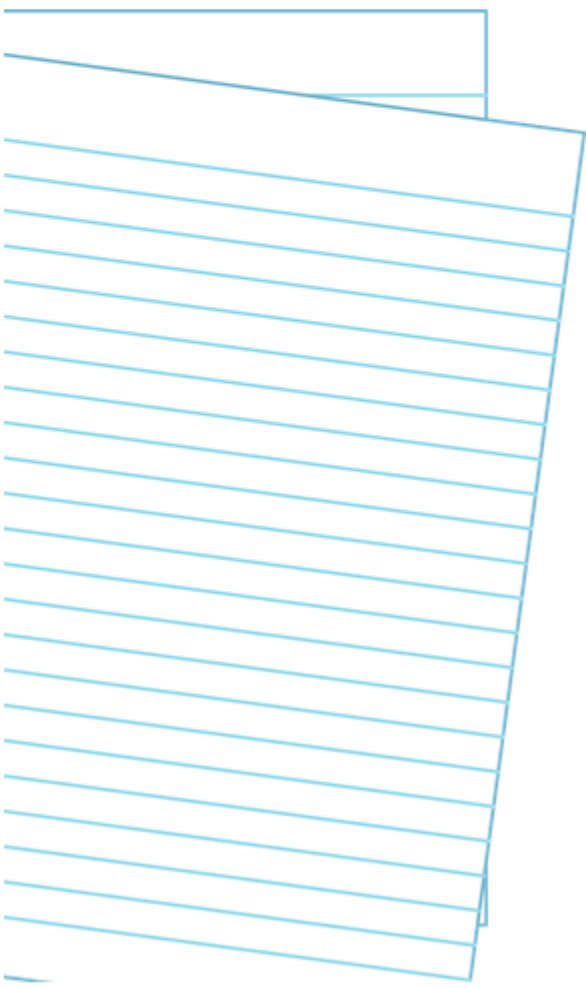

- Pay for programs using secure and convenient digital payment methods, including Apple Pay

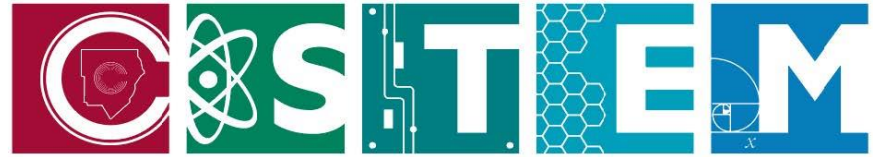

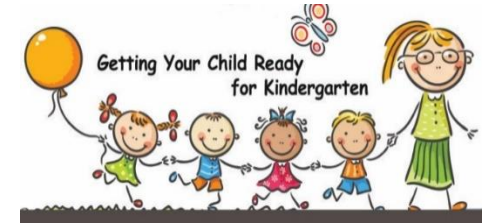
