Dear Keheley Community,



The transition from preschool to elementary school (or one grade to the next) comes with a lot of change, and your child may be adjusting to new routines and expectations. No matter how your child responds to change, all kids need support in learning how to handle the ups and downs of life-even in elementary school. You can be there with them, teaching them how to cope with challenges, manage stress and make healthy choices along the way. These skills ultimately help your elementary schooler build

Tech Tip

October is Cybersecurity Awareness Month—a perfect time to enhance your family's online safety. By setting up a family media plan, you can help your child develop healthy digital habits and stay safe online.

Why it's important: A family media plan helps balance screen time and ensures that children use technology safely and responsibly.

How to create one:

- 1. Set Clear Rules: Establish rules about when and where devices can be used. For example, no screens during meals or an hour before bedtime.
- 2. Discuss Online Safety: Talk about which websites are safe to visit and what kind of information should never be shared online (like personal details or passwords).
- 3. Encourage Open Communication: Make sure your child feels comfortable coming to you with any online concerns or
- 4. Model Good Behavior: Show your child how to use technology responsibly by following the rules yourself.
