- Explore for the future



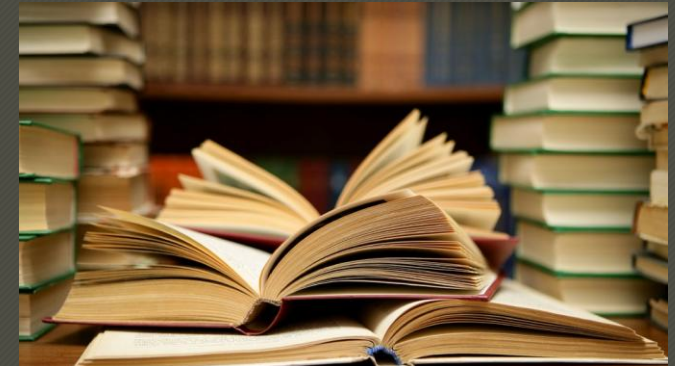
10th Grade Year Checklist

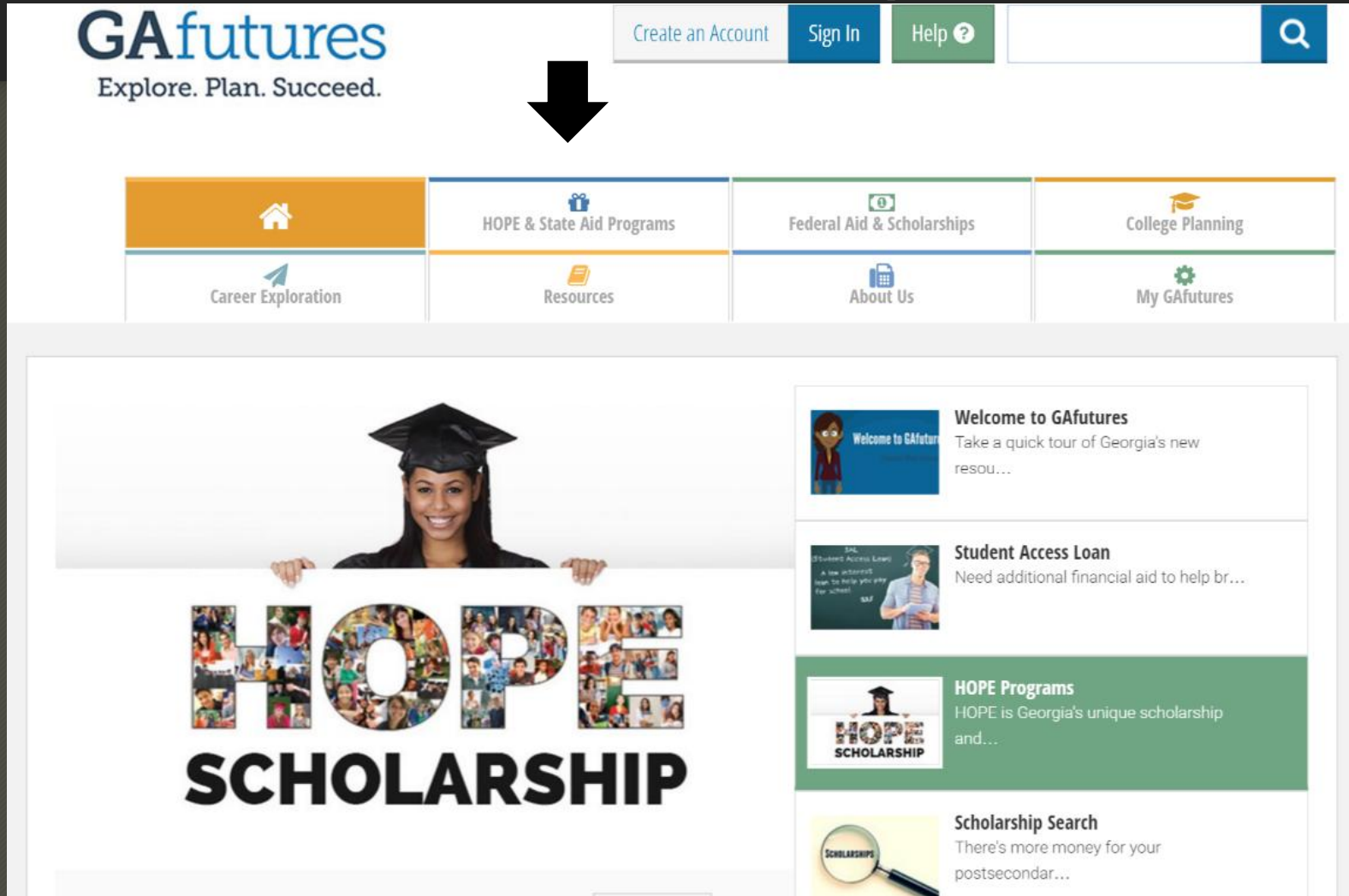


High School Graduation Requirements	College Admissions Requirements
Determined by the Georgia Department of Education	Determined by the individual school and often greater than grad requirements (i.e. World Language and certain Math requirements)
Tracked by you, your teachers, and your School Counselor	Tracked by YOU. It is your responsibility to find out what the school you are applying to requires
Must be met before you earn a diploma	Must take ACT or SAT for 4-year schools or the Accuplacer test for 2 yr and technical schools *Check individual school requirements for testing!
	Again: meeting high school graduation requirements does not guarantee admissions!

Is there HOPE for me?

Scholarship

- 3.0 Core GPA Needed (can be earned in college)
- **4 Rigor Courses**
- Two-year or four-year degree
- Must graduate from a GA high school
- Must be a GA resident for at least one year (Green Card or citizenship)
- Covers a **percentage** of tuition

Grant

- No initial GPA requirement
- Technical certificate or diploma
- Must have a high school diploma or GED
- Must be a GA resident for at least one year (Green Card or citizenship)
- Covers a **percentage** of tuition

Apply for HOPE through FAFSA or GSFAPPS after October 1st of your senior year.



Zell Miller

Zell Miller Scholarship

- Requires a 3.7 Core High School GPA
- Requires 1200 SAT Math and Reading/Verbal or 25 ACT
- Pays for a two-year or four-year degree
- Must graduate from a Georgia High School
- Must be a GA Resident for at least one year (Green Card or citizenship)
- Covers **full** tuition
- Applies automatically for Valedictorian or Salutatorian
- Must maintain a 3.5 college GPA

Zell Miller Grant

- Requires a 3.5 College GPA for grant eligibility
- Does not require a minimum test score
- Pays for certificate, diploma, or two-year degree
- Must graduate from a Georgia High School
- Must be a GA resident for at least one year (Green Card or citizenship)
- Covers **full** tuition (retroactively covers previous semester once 3.5 GPA is earned)
- Must maintain a 3.5 college GPA

All classes that begin with the following numbers...

23. x English

27. x Mathematics

26. x Science

40. x Science

45. x Social Studies

60. x World language

61. x World language

?? x Additional courses approved for fourth
year of science

HOPE counts all courses
that begin with the listed
numbers.... **BOTH** required
and elective courses.

Review HOPE *rigor* requirements



HOPE Rigor Requirements

- To be HOPE eligible, the class of 2029 must earn at least 4 credits in rigor courses.
- Don't worry! HOPE rigor does not mean they need all AP and honors classes. Here are a few examples of HOPE rigor. For a more comprehensive list, go to Gafutures.org
