

Our Goals for Students Achievement

District Improvement Plan goals:

Goal #1: By SY26, increase growth by 2 percentage points, for students scoring at the proficient and distinguished levels, as evidenced by the state assessments.

Goal #2: By SY28, increase graduation rate from 87% to 88% as measured by GaDOE adjusted cohort graduation rate.

Fair Oaks Elementary goals for Student Achievement:

Goal #1: ELA The number of students k-2 scoring above grade level will increase from 61 (17%) in Spring 2024 to 125 (35%) students in Spring 2025 as measured by the 2024-2025 Amira Screener.

Goal #2: Math The percent of 2nd Grade students scoring proficient will increase from 18% (Midyear MI) to 40% as measured by the BEACON Assessment

Teachers, Parents, and Students – Together for Success

Teachers. The 2nd Grade Fair Oaks Elementary School teachers will work with students and their families to develop students' love of learning. The focus of our key connections with families will be:

- ✓ Teachers will provide books in person or on CTLS for students to practice at home.
- ✓ Teachers will provide resources on CTLS such as spelling lists and videos from current spelling pattern for practice.
- ✓ Teachers will send home incomplete assignments for students to finish.
- ✓ Teachers will add resources and games for fact fluency on CTLS so that students can practice math facts at home.

At Home. Fair Oaks Elementary School parents joined staff to develop ideas about how families can support students' academic understanding. Families may have other ideas to add to the list:

- ✓ Parents will listen to their child read for 25 minutes and ask questions about what they read.
- ✓ Parents will go on their child's CTLS classroom to get resources for their child to practice spelling at home.
- ✓ Parents will help their child complete unfinished assignments sent home.
- ✓ Parents will help students log on to CTLS so that students can practice fact fluency through games and activities.

Students. Fair Oaks Elementary School students joined staff and parents to develop ideas about how they can succeed in school:

- ✓ Students will read at least 25 minutes a day independently.
- ✓ Students will go on their CTLS classroom to receive lists for spelling practice.
- ✓ Students will complete unfinished work from class and return it the next day.
- ✓ Students will log on to CTLS and practice math facts and activities.
