Have fun shopping! Grab a roll of holiday wrapping paper too!


Please attached the ornament to the gift.

Love holiday light displays? Here are some fantastic options with links around the Metro.!

Winter West Wonderland at University of West Georgia. Get in the holiday spirit with lighted displays of student-built sculptures, a holiday market and pictures with Santa Claus and Winter Wolfie. Dec. 3-6.

Winter House at Callanwolde Fine Arts Center. Enjoy twinkling lights and delicious treats in this historic mansion filled with holiday magic, activities, an artist market, photos with Santa and workshops. Through Dec. 15.

World of Illumination's Cosmic Sleighride at Six Flags White Water. Drive through this light show as Shiny the Star takes you on a mystical holiday adventure that is out of this world. Through Dec. 29.

Glow Light Show at Coolray Field. Ride through a dancing light show featuring more than 1 million LED lights. Through Dec.

A Country Christmas at Pettit Creek Farms. Take a drive or hayride through beautiful Christmas lights, visit with Santa and his reindeer from Thur.-Sun., meet the animals at the petting zoo, and taste s'mores. Through Dec. 30.

Holiday Lights of Woodstock at Hobgood Park. This walk-through light display features more than 2 million lights and benefits the Anna Crawford Children's Center. Through Dec. 30.

<u>Lights of Life at Life University.</u> Tons of holiday lights on display around the campus, plus concessions, pony rides, train rides and a petting zoo. Through Dec. 31.

Holiday Lights at Veteran's Park at Veteran's Park. View lights at this two-mile drive-thru show. Through Dec. 31.

Holiday Lights at Brook Run Park, This walkable display features 100,000 lights and runs nightly. Through Dec. 31.

Magic of Lights at Dixie Speedway. This drive-through holiday lights show features holiday scenes and characters of the season using LED technology and digital animations. Through Jan. 4.

Winter Lantern Festival at Gwinnett County Fairgrounds. Step into a dazzling world of light with more than 1,000 Chinese lanterns, and explore interactive experiences. Through Jan. 5.

Stone Mountain Christmas at Stone Mountain Park. Immerse yourself in holiday magic with a Christmas Drone Show,

dazzling lights, festive music, spectacular shows, holiday characters and more. Through Jan. 5.

Holiday in the Park at Six Flags Over Georgia. More than 1 million LED lights, dozens of Christmas trees, festive shows and culinary treats create the perfect winter wonderland atmosphere. Through Jan. 5.

<u>Christmasville Tinseltown at Alexander Park West.</u> This free walkable light show is hosted by the City of McDonough. Through Jan. 6.

Garden Lights, Holiday Nights at Atlanta Botanical Garden. This annual holiday extravaganza features millions of brilliantly colored LED lights and displays. Through Jan. 12.

IllumiNights at the Zoo: A Chinese Lantern Festival at Zoo Atlanta, Illuminated wildlife lights the night at this Chinese lantern festival with nature-inspired lanterns and experiences. Through Jan. 19.

Margaritaville's Lakeside Lights Spectacular at Margaritaville at Lanier Islands. Go on a magical walk through an amazing light show set to seasonal music. Through Jan. 20.

Tech Tip

Screen Time at Bedtime

Draw a line between screen time and bedtime

Getting a good night's rest helps recharge our bodies and minds. And screens can keep us from falling asleep by delaying our bodies' release of melatonin (the hormone that helps us sleep). So it's important to turn off all screens—TVs, phones, tablets, etc.—at least an hour before bedtime. By turning screens off before bed, kids will have more time to "wind down" with activities like reading, listening to music or journaling.

In addition to easing away from screens before bed, keep all screens out of your child's bedroom. A beep, vibration or burst of light can break a sleep cycle. Removing devices from the bedroom also means kids can't text, call or play throughout the night. For more tips and tricks click here.
