COVID-19 changes

Below are the procedures that were put in place to support our students during the spring semester of 2020 due to the COVID-19 pandemic;

- As of March 13, 2020, the Cobb County students transitioned to virtual learning.
- Students had the opportunity to continue virtual learning in order to improve their grade during the remainder of the spring semester.
- Students were encouraged to continue working on their courses to learn new material in addition to improving their grade during this time.
- The state testing requirements were waived by the state of Georgia.
- The spring semester end date did not change. The last date of spring semester was May 20, 2020.

Beginning in the fall semester of 2020, the following procedures will be put in place to continue to support our students.

- The start date for students has been moved from August 3, 2020 to August 17, 2020.
- Students will start the school year in a virtual learning environment.
- There is a plan to transition back to face-to-face learning when the data supports that this is safe for students and staff.
- The Cobb County School District is waiting to hear is the state of Georgia will again waive the state testing requirements.

Each Academy has an application process that involves teacher recommendations and course and grade pre-requisites that are spelled out for each Academy.

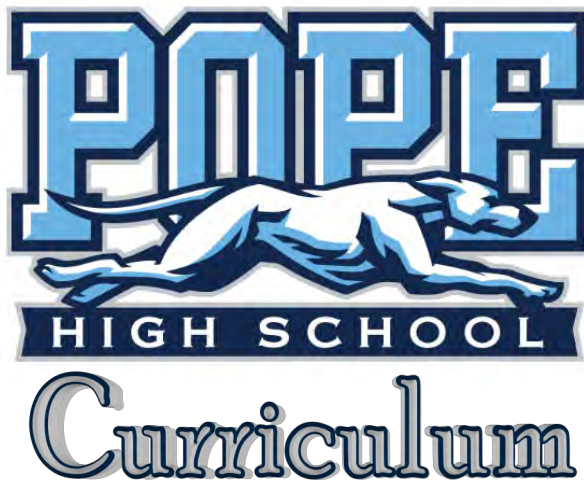
Students graduating from an Academy will have a profile for that academy attached to their transcript
