FINANCIAL SUSTAINABILITY



Support local control of decision-making



Require fiscal notes for all education legislation that would affect school funding



Oppose diversion of funds from public education



Apply the same standards of accountability to all recipients of public money for education

EDUCATIONAL ACCESS



Sustain Teachers Retirement System as currently structured



Apply charter waivers to SWSS systems



Incentivize higher education for teachers



Provide adequate funding to provide literacy coaches and professional learning to all schools

SAFETY AND SECURITY



Maintain or increase safety and security categorical grant funding



Support stronger criminal penalties for threats against schools



Increase protections for minors against access to THC and vape products
