District Goals for Student Achievement

2024-2025 CCSD District Goals

- By SY26, increase growth by 2 percentage points, for students scoring at the proficient and distinguished levels, as evidenced by state assessments.
- by SY28, increase graduation rate from 87% to 88% as measured by GaDOE adjusted cohort graduation rate.

Osborne's Goal(s) for Student Achievement

Goal #1: By May 2027, the graduation rate of the FY27 cohort will increase from our current 74.33 to 78.3%.

Goal #2 Increase the percentage of students performing proficient on Algebra I EOC from 16.07% to 17.03% in Fall 2024 and 120 Students of incoming 701 will score proficient or higher in Algebra EOC by May 2025.

Goal #3: Students scoring proficient plus advanced on the CCRPI American Lit EOC will increase from 28% to 29.62% (CCRPI Closing the Gap). Our goal is for 203 (685 approximate total) students to be proficient plus advanced by May 2025.
