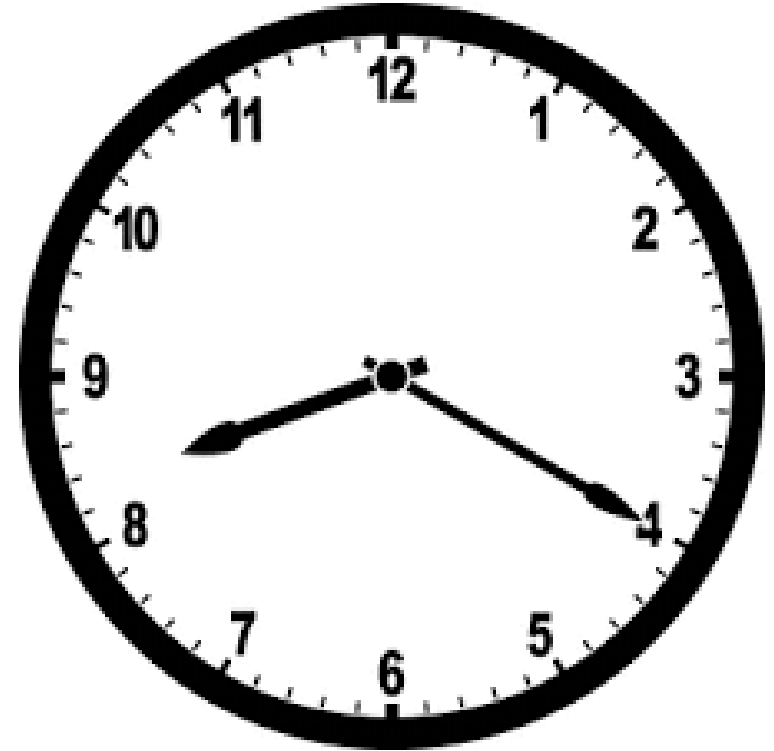
1st BLOCK BEGINS AT 8:20 AM!!

- You are at the vending machine, deciding to use the restroom, or still in the hall

ATTENDANCE

- Absence notes must be given to Ms. Guzman in the attendance office within 3 days
- Tardies due to missing the bus, traffic, oversleeping, car trouble, etc., are unexcused
- Upon the 8th unexcused tardy, the student will receive 1 day of Detention FOR 3rd BLOCK



PASSES

- Every teacher will have two lanyards for bathroom pass use. The lanyards will be color-coded for the floor level in which the teacher's class is located. *Students should not travel from one floor to another floor unless they have an official hand-written pass.*
- Students may receive discipline if they are in an unauthorized area or on the wrong floor during lunchtime.
- Students will not be allowed to eat lunch in the classroom.
- Passes are mandatory and must be visible at all times – whether a lanyard or paper pass.
- Dual Enrollment, Work-Based-Learning, Minimum Day and CVA students must present their passes when leaving campus and checking in to school.



BEVERAGES AND FOOD

Students are expected to report directly to lunch!

Students may eat lunch in any one of the permitted areas:

- Cafeteria
- Courtyard outside of the cafeteria
- CITA Courtyard (with a pass)

Students are not allowed to eat lunch in the following areas:

- Classes
- Learning Commons
- Charging Stations

Students are to follow teacher classroom policies regarding snacks.





BEVERAGES AND FOOD

- You may not have food delivered to campus!
- That means no Uber Eats, no GRUBHUB, etc.
- If you have food delivered, the administration team will keep it until 3:45 PM, at which time you can pick it up.
- 1st offense will be assigned a consequence of ISS. Progressive discipline will be assigned for repeated violations.





STUDENT BEHAVIOR

Behavior in the Cafeteria

- Students are expected to display appropriate behavior in the cafeteria and courtyard. Lunch is a class that students must attend in the cafeteria or courtyard. **This is not an open campus and therefore you may not leave for lunch.**

Students are expected to clean up their area and pick up any trash after eating lunch.

Help to keep our campus neat and clean.

- Students are expected to display appropriate and respectful behavior in the lunch lines. No skipping in lunch lines.
- **Leaving school grounds – 2 days of ISS**

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DRIVING

In accordance with O.C.G.A.40-5-22, we are required to report to the Department of Driver Services any student

- who has dropped out of school OR has remained out of school for ten consecutive school days;
- Or has been suspended from school for threatening, striking, or causing bodily harm to a teacher or other school personnel;
- Who has possession of or sale of drugs or alcohol on school property;
- Any sexual offense prohibited under Chapter 6 of Title 16

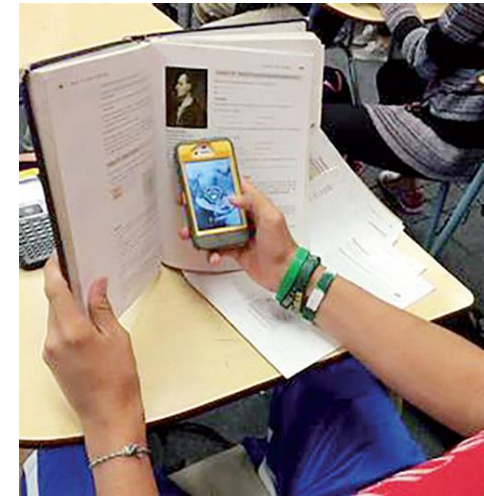
Your license may be suspended.





CELL PHONES

- OSBORNE HIGH SCHOOL assumes no responsibility for your lost or stolen phone. You need to protect your phone as you would at the mall. **We will not search for your phone.** You can file a police report with the campus officer.
- Social media outlets should be used in a positive and meaningful way – and not during the school day.
- Cell phone usage must be approved by the classroom teacher during class time.





EVERYONE

- No underwear visible.
- No midriff visible.
 - No see-through clothing that reveals midriff
- Clothing with holes....
 - Cannot reveal any skin above the upper thigh.
- Shorts/skirts/dress should be visible.
 - (No lamp shading)
- No dresses or shirts with no straps.
- No low-cut shirts.



EVERYONE

- No bandanas.



EVERYONE

- No profane slogans or words on clothing.
- No illegal substance slogans or pictures.
 - Ex: beer, tobacco, marijuana, weapons, thc, etc.





If a student is in
violation of dress
code.....

- Students will be asked to correct the dress violation, and warnings will only be given in the first three days of the semester.
- First discipline for dress code will result in 1 day of ISS.
- Teachers will first attempt to resolve the violation within the classroom.
- If the student needs a new article of clothing in order to meet the dress code, they must report to the front office.
- Student may be sent to ISS if suitable clothing is not available.



STUDENT BEHAVIOR

DRUGS/ALCOHOL/WEAPONS

- Minimum 10 days OSS
- Parking privileges may be revoked
- Police charges may be filed
- Student Hearing for Expulsion with a recommendation to attend Cobb Acceleration Academy (alternative school) for the remainder of the school year





Tardies

- 8th tardy 1 day of Detention FOR 3rd BLOCK
- 11th tardy 2 days of Detention FOR 3rd BLOCK
- 14th tardy Loss of Parking Privileges (6 weeks) & 1 day of ISS
- 17th tardy Loss of Parking Privileges (Semester) & 2 days of ISS
- 20th tardy Saturday School
- 24th tardy 3 days of ISS
- 26th tardy 4 days of ISS
- 28th tardy 5 days of ISS
- 30th tardy 10 days of OSS – LTS Recommendation





USE OF TOBACCO/TOBACCO PRODUCTS

- Any use of Tobacco/Tobacco Products will result in a minimum of 5 days of OSS.
- This includes vaping and being in possession of vaping products
- Any student that is with a group of students in the bathroom or bathroom stall where smoking/vaping occurs they may receive a minimum of 5 days of OSS.



- After 8:20 AM students should enter the building through the main entrance near the attendance office. Students are not allowed to open doors for anyone after this time.
- Students who open unauthorized doors or gates may receive 3 days of OSS.
- All students are expected to be outside the building by 3:45 PM.
- Students who are participating in an after-school activity should be in their designated area by 3:45 PM.
- Students who are in the school building or in an unauthorized area after 3:45 PM may receive student discipline.
- Students waiting on a ride will have the option to wait in the Atrium (front) lobby.

STUDENT BEHAVIOR



FIGHTING

- 10 Days minimum of OSS plus a recommendation for expulsion for the remainder of the semester (or more)
- Police charges may be filed
- Student discipline hearing

VERBAL ALTERCATION

- 3 Days OSS

PHYSICAL ALTERCATION

- 5 Days OSS

PARTY TO THE OFFENSE

- Students who are filming, encouraging, or do not remove themselves from the situation may receive a minimum of 3 days of OSS
- Days listed above represent minimum discipline to be assigned.

STUDENT BEHAVIOR



STEALING

- Attempt/threaten/actually steal, in possession, damage or vandalize property
 - 5 to 10 days OSS
 - Police charges may be filed



STUDENT BEHAVIOR



Bullying/Harassment

- If you are being harassed and/or bullied, report this directly to the administration so an investigation and proper action can be taken

BULLYING IS

- **Repeatedly** making racial, gender, religious, or sexual orientation slurs
- **Repeatedly** making fun of someone's weight, disability, physical appearance, economic status
- Making threats and using intimidation to gain power over someone
- **This includes any defamatory remarks, threats, or other unacceptable and demeaning remarks in any social media platform even outside of school hours.**
- **Bullying will result in a consequence of OSS.**

BULLYING IS NOT

- A statement of dislike toward or about someone (who cares if they don't like you)
- A single act of telling a joke about someone
- Arguments or heated disagreements between two or more people/groups (could be verbal altercation)

STUDENT BEHAVIOR



BULLYING

- Do not participate
- Do not be a bystander
- Avoid anyone who may bother you
- Do not engage with that person (face-to-face or via social media)
- Block them on social media
- Hurtful comments, chats, posts, or emails should be provided to administration or campus officers
- **If you feel you are being bullied, speak with an administrator to let him/her know.**

Supports Offered at Osborne

What is WOW?

- **What is W.O.W. Day:**
 - Designated time on Wednesdays to WORK ON WORK (W.O.W.)
 - Students will either remediate or enrich during this time
 - This will occur during the last 45 minutes of class
 - Direct support will be offered by your teachers
- **When:**
 - Wednesdays during all classes
- **Purpose:**
 - To allow students of all levels with academic enrichment or support opportunities.
- **Students who have a 78 or higher in ALL Classes by the cut off date will be eligible for BONUS BLOCK.**



What is **WOW BONUS BLOCK**?

- When grades are checked, BONUS BLOCK is the day for **rewarding students** for their academic achievement.
- **QUALIFICATION**
 - Students must have a 78 or higher in all classes when grades are checked.
- **WHAT DOES IT LOOK LIKE?**
- During 4th Block, all eligible students will have two options:
 - **BONUS BLOCK PARTY**
 - Held in the Arena or Outside Area, depending on the weather
 - Students will be provided with rewards including, but not limited to Kona Ice, Pizza, DJ & Music, Food Trucks, Yard Games, and time with your friends.
 - **EARLY DISMISSAL**
 - Parents of eligible students will be provided with a permission slip in ParentVue. If your parent signs this permission slip, you are permitted to leave campus on the day of Bonus Block.
- The First Bonus Block is scheduled for September 19th
