

The Georgia Department of Behavioral Health and Developmental Disabilities (DBHDD)

oversees programs and services for individuals with developmental disabilities, including those that provide long-term, intensive supports after high school. Through DBHDD, individuals may apply for Medicaid waivers such as the NOW (New Options Waiver) and COMP (Comprehensive Supports Waiver). These waivers help cover the cost of essential services like adult day programs, supported employment, residential services, and in-home care for those with significant needs. To access these services, individuals must meet eligibility requirements and complete an intake process through DBHDD's regional office system. Families are encouraged to apply early, as wait times for services can be long.

NOW/COMP Medicaid Waiver

The New Options Waiver (NOW) and the Comprehensive Supports Waiver Program (COMP) offer home- and community-based services for individuals with intellectual disabilities or other closely related conditions, such as cerebral palsy, epilepsy, autism or neurological problems.











Eligibility Criteria:

- Eligible for Medicaid.
- Have a diagnosis of an intellectual disability and/or a closely related condition.

Required Documentation to Apply:

- Application
- Psychological Report (Including IQ scores, adaptive scores, and/or Autism Spectrum Disorder assessments if applicable)
- Proof of Citizenship
- Copy of Social Security Card (or number)
- Copy of Medicaid and/or Medicare card
- Copy of Social Security benefit information
- Copy of guardianship documents (if applicable)
- Most recent IEP
- Signed Notice of Privacy Practices

Eligibility Requirements

- The adult must have a physical or mental disability that:
 - Is severe and creates functional limitations.
 - Prevents gainful employment.
 - Has lasted for more than 12 months and is expected to continue.
- Adult income is limited to less than \$1500. .

Frequently Asked Questions

- How long does the process take?
 - Depending on the need for appeals, the process can take anywhere from three months to two years.
- What kind of documentation do I need?
 - If you make an appointment or apply online, you will receive a list of documents.
- Can anyone help me manage my benefits?

Benefits Navigation

Family Support Services

Family Support Services provide funding assists families in obtaining disability-related goods and services. Family support funding is not income-based, but it is based on each family and individual's unique needs. Individuals cannot already be receiving services through the NOW or Comp Waivers.





Eligibility Criteria:

- Three years of age or older.
- Documentation of an intellectual or developmental disability prior to age 22.
