CHANGING CLASSES

One thing that makes middle school different from elementary school is that you will change classes.

You will have five academic classes, including math, language arts, science, social studies, and reading, as well as two connections classes.



CONNECTION CLASSES

Students attend two periods of Connections each day. Chorus, band, and orchestra are year-long, and students will not be moved from these classes without director permission.

Other connection classes change each quarter to give students the opportunity to be exposed to different disciplines.

Chorus (6th - 8th year-long)

Chorus is a year-long, performance-based class. All course objectives pertain to the experience of performing choral music. Students will learn to read music at sight (sight-reading), notate music, use proper breath support, use appropriate posture for singing, use good diction, sing in a head voice with appropriate tone, and light choreography. They will experience music of all genres and many different cultures.

Band (6th - 8th year-long)

The purpose of the band program is to give students a solid foundation in the basics of music and to provide the opportunity to enhance this knowledge through performance. The following topics will be covered as our skills develop throughout the year: proper posture, breathing techniques, characteristic tone quality, rhythmic studies, articulation, major scales, musical terms, music theory, music history and band literature.

Orchestra (6th - 8th year-long)

The following topics will be covered as our skills develop through the year: characteristic tone quality of string instruments, rhythmic studies, bowing technique development, left-hand finger patterns, scales and arpeggios, ear training, music reading, music vocabulary, shifting, vibrato, music theory, music history, composer study, orchestral literature, and musical creativity.

Physical Education (6th year-long - 7th & 8th one semester)

Students who are not enrolled in a music class may have a year-long PE class. The goal is for all students to be introduced to and learn about a variety of physical activities, team and individual sports, as well as to increase overall fitness and health.

Project Lead the Way (6th nine-weeks) ; Foundations of Computer Programming (7th one semester) ; Technological Systems (8th one semester)

The purpose of Project Lead the Way is to develop technological literacy as part of all students' fundamental education through an activity-based study of past, present, and future technological systems and their resources, processes, and impact on society.

Art (6th year-long - 7th & 8th one semester)

Students will participate in both written and studio production activities which include; art history, art criticism, aesthetics, and art production. Through looking at, talking about, and making art, students can develop a positive appreciation for the arts as well as an informed understanding of the art process. We also offer a high school art class to eighth graders that is based on submitted portfolio in 7th grade.

Spanish (6th year-long - 7th one semester); Spanish 1 High School (8th grade year-long)

This class is designed for the novice Spanish speaker. Students will build skills in listening, speaking, reading, and writing during instructional lessons. Gradually students will begin using Spanish to respond to questions, ask questions, make requests, and navigate through basic introductory conversations. Additionally, the culture, perspectives, practices, and products of various Spanish-speaking countries will be explored. We also offer a high school Spanish 1 class in 8th grade. This class is an advanced content class based on established criteria.

Health Education (6th year-long - 7th & 8th one semester)

In the health education class, students will learn about factors that affect health and how the choices they make can impact their health.



LOCKERS & PHONES

Students will be assigned lockers. Specific locker access times will be provided. Lockers are school property. Students should not share a locker nor share the combination to their locker. Cell phones and electronic devices should be kept in a student's assigned locker, along with their backpack, lunch box, etc.

Cell phones/electronic devices should always be kept in a student's locker. The school is not responsible for lost, stolen, or damaged devices.

Students will be allowed to use the telephone in the front office for emergency purposes only. If a parent needs to contact a student (emergency only), the parent can call and leave a message, and the front office will relay it to the student.



WEATHER & CALENDAR



Weather: If you have a student in the Cobb County School District, your information is ALREADY in our Automated Contact System and you will receive notifications by every means you have provided to your local school (landline, cell phone, text, email, etc.). However, it is critical that you make sure we have your most up-to-date numbers and addresses.

BUS TRANSPORTATION

Students must ride their assigned bus, and appropriate behavior is expected at all times. Riding the bus is a privilege, and we want everyone to enjoy a safe and respectful ride. Please follow all bus rules—students who do not may lose the privilege to ride. Always listen carefully to bus announcements for updates and instructions.

EARLY CHECK OUTS



Your student will be called to the front office upon your arrival. Parents/guardians will sign out their students at the front office. If someone other than the enrolling parent/guardian is to check the student out, this person must be listed by the enrolling adult on enrollment forms. The enrolling adult may update the names of individuals allowed to check out students using the ParentVUE system. Anyone checking out a student must provide a picture ID. No students will be allowed to check out after 3:45 pm.

GRADES

Your grades will be taken from your daily class work, homework, quizzes, tests, and any special projects. Numerical grades are used on the report card. The current grading scale is:

A = 90 - 100 B = 80 - 89 C = 74 - 79 D = 70 - 73 F = below 70

If a student is having difficulty in a class, it is important for the student to seek help from the classroom teacher

Teachers have help sessions before tests and at other times when a student indicates that help is needed. These sessions are before or after school. Check with your teacher.

Pine Mountain Middle School breaks the school year into four, nine-week grading periods. Report cards are issued electronically at the end of each quarter. Progress reports are available between report cards. ParentVUE is available for parents/guardians and students to access grades and attendance 24/7.

Weekly updated grades will be available each Thursday. As a result, progress reports and report cards are not printed and distributed to families.

INTRAMURALS & CLUBS

Although the Intramural Program is an extension of the Physical Education class, any student can participate-you do not need to be enrolled in PE to join. Intramurals offer extra time for competitive games, individual practice, and skill-building instruction.



WHAT ARE CLIMB DAYS?

The CLIMB Behavior System aims to teach the Pine Mountain core values to students while combining acknowledgment of positive student behavior, maximizing instructional time, increasing student achievement, and fostering a productive and safe learning environment. The core values represented in CLIMB include exercising Commitment, showing Leadership, demonstrating Integrity, being Mindful, and maintaining Balance. These expectations are explicitly taught to our students at the beginning of the school year and reviewed as needed.

Each Friday, our PMMS students participate in instructional and behavior periods called CLIMB Academic Period and CLIMB Behavior Period. This means that on Fridays students will have nine periods of classes (students have 7 periods of classes on Monday – Thursday). CLIMB is approximately 40 minutes and is part of our school's RTI process. CLIMB is also a part of our PBIS program. The CLIMB Period allows our PMMS staff members the opportunity to provide support to our students in one of the following areas:

1.CLIMB Instructional Period (every Friday morning)

- CLIMB Instructional Period provides students enrichment or remediation opportunities for the standards being taught based on summative assessments (like chapter tests).
- 2.CLIMB Behavior Period (every Friday afternoon)
 - CLIMB Behavior Expectation provides students enrichment or remediation opportunities based on our core values and the behaviors that reflect within those values.

We want to reward students who consistently demonstrate Pine Mountain Middle School's CLIMB values: Commitment, Leadership, Integrity, Mindfulness, Balance. One way we do this is through Fresh Air Fridays and other special activities that students earn by meeting our behavior expectations. Keep CLIMBing and make it a great day.

DRESS CODE

The Cobb County School District recognizes that the dress and grooming of students, individually and collectively, are significant factors in the successful operations of our educational program. One of the educational responsibilities of the school is to help make students aware that appropriate appearances and hygiene are conducive to the well-being of themselves and others.

Each student will be expected to maintain a standard of dress and grooming consistent with the level of formality of the school situation. We seek the assistance of parents in monitoring their child(ren)'s clothing to ensure that it is appropriate for the classroom.

Clothing that is distracting, disruptive, or creates an unsafe situation may not be worn to school. If a child is not appropriately dressed, a parent may be contacted. The dress code applies to all school functions. These minimum standards should help define appropriate school dress:

Rule of "thumb": Look in the mirror just before leaving your home. If you doubt what you are wearing, you should consider wearing something else. Don't forget: Clothing must be modest and not revealing or provocative.

- Clothing must be modest and not revealing or provocative. Tank tops and halters are not permitted. However, tank tops may be worn under a jacket or sweater. Cleavage must not show.
- Clothing must be worn as it was intended - overalls secured over both shoulders, pants with both legs down etc.
- Clothing must not reveal underwear. Clothing must not be see-through or reveal the midriff or buttocks.
- No sagging pants: all pants will be worn at the waist.
- No pajama pants or house slippers.
- Bike shorts (like spandex type of shorts) can be worn if the buttocks are covered.
- No hats, stocking caps, do-rags, bandanas, sweat headbands, forehead bands, hoods, etc., can be worn inside the building.
- Students may not wear clothing that displays or advertises obscene slogans or signs, profanity, gang symbols, gangrelated materials, or any substance illegal for minors, such as beer, tobacco, etc.
- Clothing or ornamentation advocating, promoting, or suggesting illegal activity is prohibited.
