Daily Schedule


Your child's teacher will send out their classroom schedule via CTLS. Schedules will have specific lunch and recess times, as well as their specials rotation.






Take Home Folders

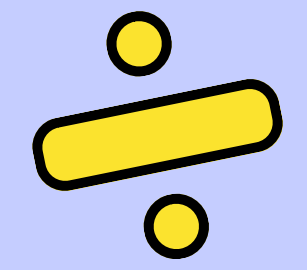
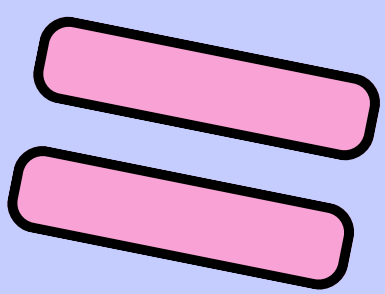
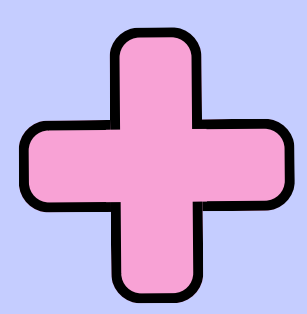
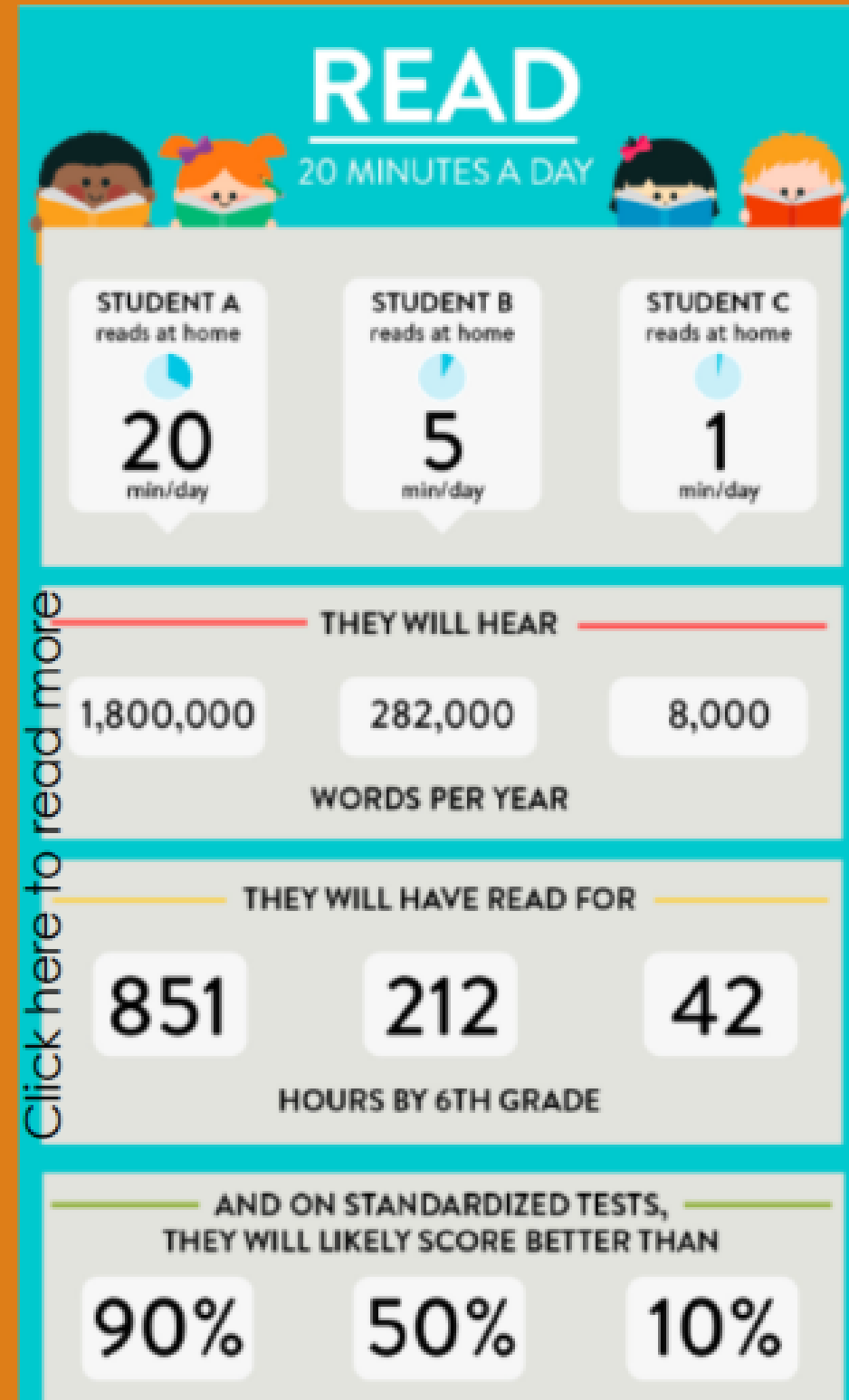
We want to encourage independence however, there will be times that you may need to support your child in some areas. Please allow your child to make mistakes, so we know where they may need additional support at school.



Homework

We encourage you to have your child read each day for about 20 minutes or more. Student can read alone, aloud to you, or to a family member. Daily reading time is essential to student growth.

Students who read 20 minutes a day outside of school tend to have improved language skills, a better understanding of the world, stronger relationships, and outscore their peers on tests by 90%.



It is important to read to your child early as a child's brain is 80% developed by age three, 90% developed by age six, and the remaining 10% continues to develop through age 25. But the benefits of reading don't stop there.

Quarter 1- Addition and Subtraction within 10


Quarter 2, 3, and 4- Addition and Subtraction facts within 20.

Please label your child's water bottle and be sure that it is leak free! Please only send water to school. No other drinks for snack time.






Lunch




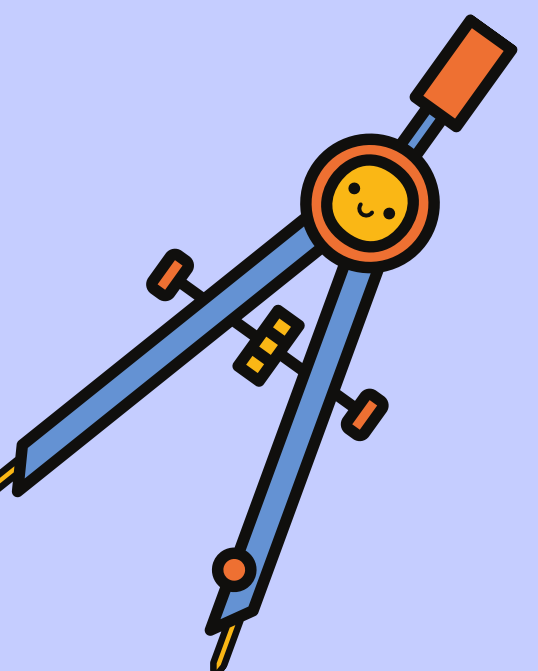
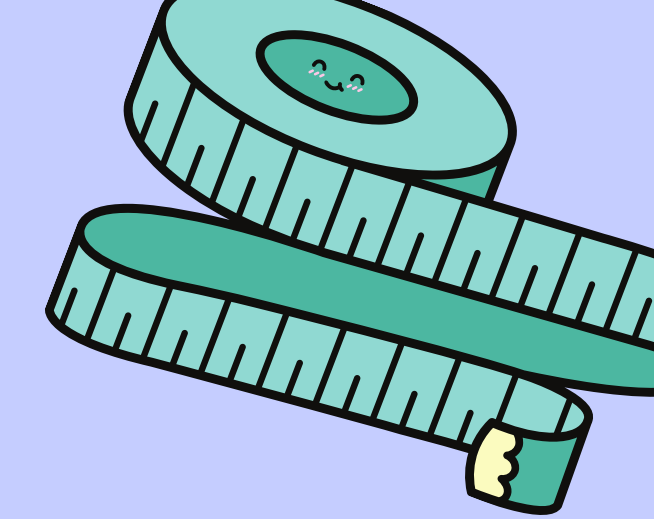
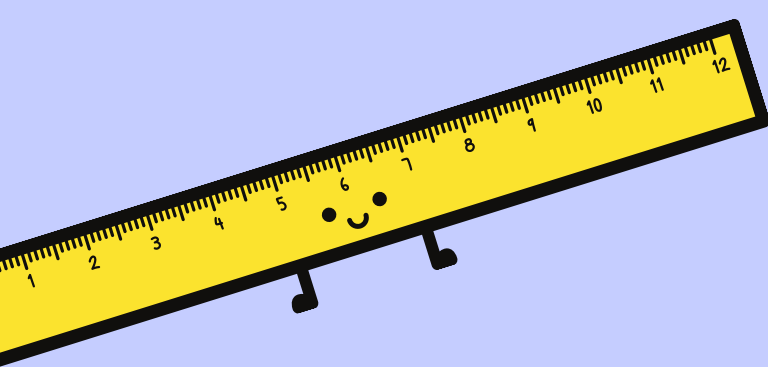
Money

All money brought for school lunch or field trips is placed in a safe for the bookkeeper. She will post the money to your account.

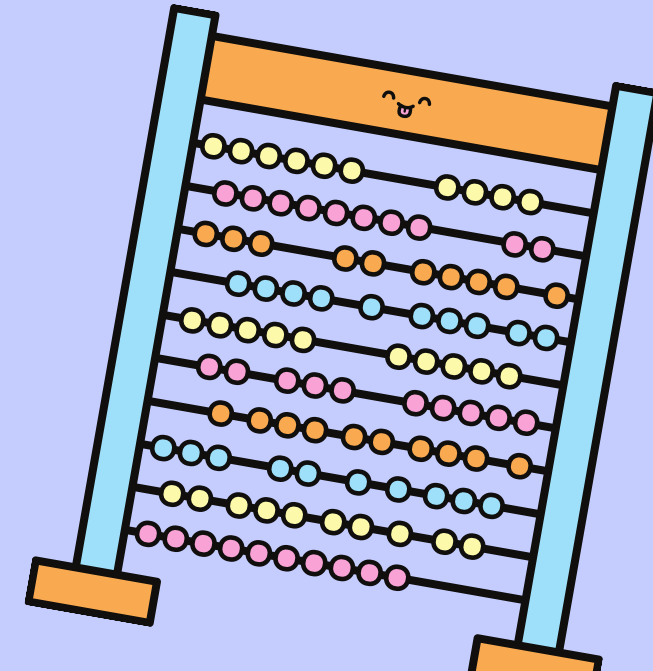
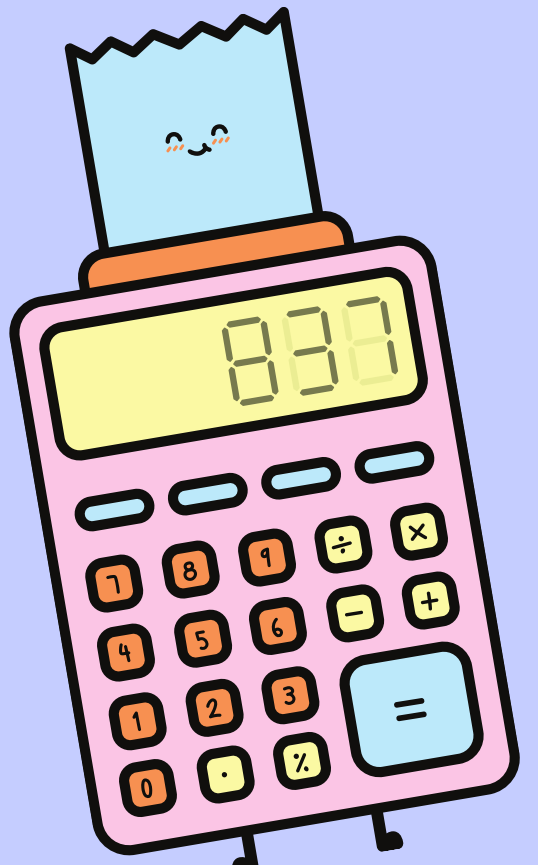
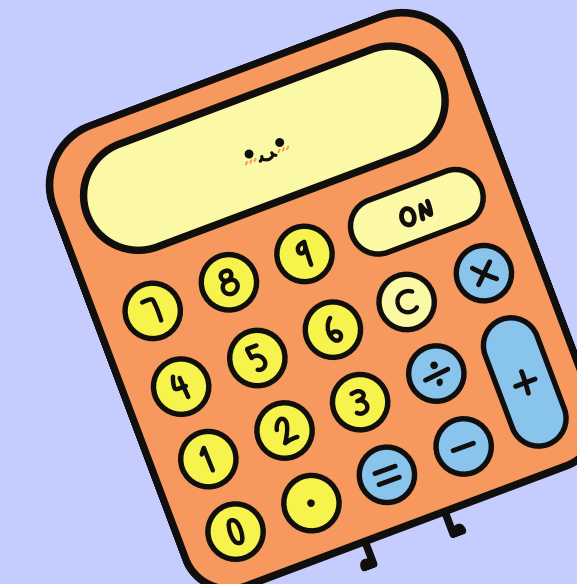
Also, you can use MyPaymentPlus for lunch money and field trips.

- We appreciate your understanding and flexibility in all carpool matters, and please remember that it will take a little time to work through the efficiency due to the volume expected.




Go Safe
