District Goals for Student Achievement

- Increase student performance in all core content areas by 2% annually as measured by achievement data.
- CCSD will increase the participation rate of families and communities engaging in services/programs by 10% as measured by CLTS Parent data, survey results & web view module.
- By 2023, we will reorganize the professional learning framework to meet the needs of all students to ensure alignment with the superintendent priorities as measured by professional learning opportunities, surveys, and student achievement.
- By the end of the 2025 school year, every school will have identified practices and resources that support student success as measured by student achievement, perception and discipline data.

Cooper Middle School Goal(s) for Student Achievement

Goal 1 By the end of the 2023-2024 school year, the percentage of students scoring at the Proficient and Advanced Level will be 70% (with enrollment at 1060) on the Reading Inventory.

Goal 2 By the end of the 2023-2024 school year, the percentage of students scoring at the Proficient and Advanced Level will be 50% (with enrollment at 1060) on the Math Inventory.

Goal 3 By the end of the 2023-2024 school year, the percentage of students scoring at the Proficient Level will be 70% (with enrollment at 1060) on the Social Studies Common Summative Assessments.

Goal 4 By the end of the 2023-2024 school year, the percentage of students scoring at the Proficient Level will be 70% (with enrollment at 1060) on the Common Summative Assessments for Science.

Goal 5 By the end of the 2023-2024 school year, the PBIS team will work with all students and staff to decrease classroom disruption by 25% (move from 200-150 or fewer disruption referrals).

- Pre-teach vocabulary prior to introducing new reading material.

Strategy #2

- Increase opportunities for independent reading time in class.

Strategy #3

- In math, implement new or review concepts scaffolding.

- Students will continue to use classroom strategies to complete independent/collaborative assignments.

- Students will sign up and attend help sessions/tutorials when offered by content teacher.
