Dear Parents and Guardians,

As we welcome the arrival of the spring semester, we are excited to announce a series of engaging and educational activities planned for our 8<sup>th</sup> grade students. These activities are designed to enrich their learning experience, foster teamwork, and create lasting memories as they prepare to transition to high school.

### Spring Semester Activities Schedule:

1. **8<sup>th</sup> Grade Dance** – February 27, 2026, 6:30 – 7:00 PM Parents pictures; 7:00 – 9:00 PM students only
  - a. An evening of music, dancing, and socializing. This event is a wonderful opportunity for students to celebrate their achievements and enjoy time with friends.
  - b. Parents will be allowed to enter the building and cafeteria to take pictures. All parents, except for PTSA chaperones, will be asked to leave at 7:00 PM.
  - c. No limousines or party buses please.
  - d. Students are expected to attend the entire dance. The doors to the building will be locked and students will not be allowed to leave until being dismissed at 9:00 PM.
  - e. **Attendance:** All students planning to attend the dance should be considered present for the day. Anyone checking out before 12:45 PM will not be allowed to attend the dance. This includes late check ins i.e. – you may not check in at 10:00 and check out at 12:45. Students must be present for a minimum of 4 class periods.
  - f. **Behavior:** Administration will determine eligibility to attend the dance on a case-by-case basis for those 8<sup>th</sup> graders who do have disciplinary consequences between January 14<sup>th</sup> and February 27<sup>th</sup>.
  - g. **Dress code:** Students are encouraged to wear “church clothes,” or clothing typical for a nice dinner. Dress code will be monitored upon entering the dance and students not adhering to the dress code will not be allowed to attend.
    1. Dress pants and a collared shirt are expected. Athletic wear, shorts, and jeans are prohibited.
    2. Evening gowns are discouraged. As communicated in the school dress code, spaghetti strap or strapless dresses may only be worn with an appropriate shrug, shawl, or sweater. Dresses with cutouts and backless dresses are prohibited. The length of the dress should meet the 4-inch inseam requirement.
    3. Should a student have questions about clothing for the dance, they are encouraged to provide a picture ahead of time to ensure everyone can attend.

2. **Olympics** – *April 13<sup>th</sup> – 17<sup>th</sup> during Connections*

- a. Students will take part in various sports and games, promoting physical fitness, teamwork, and good sportsmanship. Like in years past, each homeroom will take part in daily events during connections, earning points in the three areas previously mentioned.
- b. **Dress code:** Students are encouraged to wear school-appropriate athletic wear and athletic shoes. Students should refrain from using permanent markers or temporary paint on their face and body.
- c. **Behavior:** Administration will determine eligibility to attend the dance on a case-by-case basis for those 8<sup>th</sup> graders who do have disciplinary consequences between January 14<sup>th</sup> and the dates of the Olympics.

3. **8<sup>th</sup> Grade Honors** – *May 12<sup>th</sup> 9:30 AM*

- a. Honors Ceremony reflecting the achievements of superlative 8<sup>th</sup> grade students. Invitations for those included will be sent in early May.

4. **8<sup>th</sup> Grade Celebration** – *May 19<sup>th</sup> 11:00 AM – 1:00 PM*

- a. PTSA sponsored celebration during the school day. Though not an event parents can attend, this is an event that parents can volunteer to support.
- b. Yearbook distribution

5. **8<sup>th</sup> Grade Walk** – *May 20<sup>th</sup>*

- a. As 8<sup>th</sup> grade students are dismissed, they walk the halls of Durham one last time, saying good-bye to friends, teachers, and staff. This is a student only event.
