Club Name	Description of Club
Creative Writing	Students practice writing in different genres and giving/receiving constructive feedback.
Debate Club	To support and inspire a diverse community of students who are committed to empowering others through speech and debate.
Environmental Club	Brings awareness to environmental issues through community service projects such as stream cleanups, storm drain marking, recycling, and education.
Film Appreciation Club	To discuss and analyze a variety of films from different times and cultures.

History Bowl Team	Academic competition team in the area of history.
Humanitarian Club	Provides Pope students an opportunity to create opportunities to positively impact and connect with our community through selfless acts and the promotion of human welfare.
<a href="#">Interact Club</a>	To spread the ideals of Rotary and serve in our community.
<a href="#">Key Club</a>	An international, student-led organization that provides service opportunities. Key Club values leadership skills, inclusiveness, and promotes character development.
Literary Magazine	To give students/faculty a space to publish their writing and arts, such as photography and illustrations and celebrate the creative endeavors of Pope High School.
Mock Trial	To help students acquire a working knowledge of our judicial system, develop analytical abilities and communication skills, and gain an understanding of their obligations and responsibilities as participating members of our society.
<a href="#">Model UN</a>	An authentic simulation of the UN General Assembly, UN Security Council, or other multilateral bodies, which introduces students to the world of diplomacy, negotiation, and decision-making. At Model UN, students step into the shoes of ambassadors of countries that are members of the UN.
Mountain View Tutoring Club	To develop a mentorship program for high school students to tutor elementary students at Mountain View on various subjects.
National English Honor Society	National Honor Society for English students. To promote excellence in English and enthusiasm for literature.
National Honor Society	Serves to recognize those students who have demonstrated excellence in the areas of scholarship, service, leadership, and character.
