Spotlight

Black Rhinos have been listed as critically endangered species, since 1996, by the IUCN. Many decades ago, there were about 38,000 Black Rhinos; however, because of the poaching in the 1970s-1990s, the population decreased by 85%. Some threats, besides poaching, are fragmentation, or habitat loss. In 2021, there were 3,142 Black Rhinos left, but because of the efforts put towards saving the rhinos; there are now 6,421 left. Last, one-way people helped save the animals, were by taking them on a secluded island, and the island owners were required to protect them and report them regularly to the NMET.

Amur leopards, also known as Panthera pardus orientalis, are critically endangered with less than 100 remaining as of 2024. Native to southeastern Russia and northern China these beautiful big cats are vital to their ecosystems. As apex predators they help control the population of herbivores, preventing herbivores from overgrazing. Due to habitat loss and poaching Amur leopards have almost died out with as little as 40 existing in the world during the mid-1900's. However, due to the work of countless scientists, zoologists, and animal rights activists, Amur leopards have greatly improved in numbers, but we still have work to do to protect these wild cats!

Red pandas are in danger mainly because their homes are being destroyed by logging and farming. As forests get cleared, they lose their homes and food, making it harder for them to survive. Movie Review: Wall-E (2009)

Wall-E is more than just a Pixar animated film; it's a visually stunning, emotionally powerful masterpiece that blends science fiction with heartfelt storytelling. The movie takes us on a journey through a dystopian future where Earth has been abandoned, and a single robot is left to clean up the mess humanity left behind. Wall-E is a small, rust-covered robot with a big heart. For centuries, he has compacted and stacked trash, collecting odd trinkets that fascinate him, a spork, a Rubik's cube, and even an old VHS that introduces him to love. Despite his mechanical nature, Wall-E is full of personality, and the film masterfully conveys his emotions through expressions and beeps rather than words. Wall-E's solitude transforms when a high-tech probe named Eve reaches Earth. The growth of their friendship is full of touching moments, like when Wall-E offers Eve a tiny plant he found, not realizing the result of this action. The film's second half shifts to space, where the remnants of humankind live aboard the massive spaceship Axiom. When Wall-E follows Eve into space, he sparks a rebellion against Axiom's artificial intelligence and reminds humans of their lost connection to Earth. The film exceptionally uses sound design and detailed animation.

Beyond its adorable love story, Wall-E is a cautionary tale about environmental destruction, consumerism, and the consequences of abandoning personal responsibility. I highly recomend you watch Wall-E, a rare type of film that makes you reflect on the world around you, and proves that even a nearly silent movie starring a trash-compacting robot can be moving and unforgettable.


