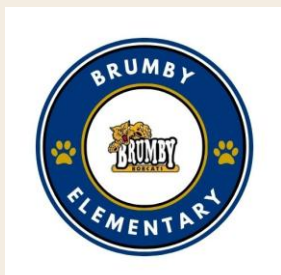

District Goals for Student Achievement

- By SY29, increase by 2percentage points the number of students performing at the proficient and distinguished lvels, as evidenced by state assessments.
- By SY29, increase graduation rate from 89% to 91% as measured by GaaDOE adjusted cohort graduation rate.

Brumby Goal(s) for Student Achievement

The average score of the staff and student GaDOE Climate Surveys will increase from 67.04 in SY25 to 72.0 in SY26.

*SY25 Staff – 67.18

*SY25 Student – 66.89 All percentages below are based on Beacon predictive scores for ELA Milestones, NOT on actual EOG percentages. These will be adjusted once ELA EOG scores have been released. 3rd-5th grade students scoring proficient and distinguished on the ELA EOG will increase from 28% in May 2026 to 31% in May 2027.

* 25% of 3rd grade students will score at the proficient or distinguished on the ELA EOG in May 2027.

*4th grade students scoring proficient or distinguished on the ELA EOG will increase from 28% in May 2026 to 30% in May 2027. 5th grade students scoring proficient or distinguished on the ELA EOG will increase from 35% in May 2026 to 38% in May 2027. 3rd-5th grade students scoring proficient and distinguished on the Math EOG will increase from 30% in May 2027 to 35% in May 2027.

*45% of 3rd grade students will score at the proficient or distinguished on the Math EOG in May 2027.

*4th grade students scoring proficient or distinguished on the Math EOG will increase from 34% in May 2026 to 40% in May 2027. 5th grade students scoring proficient or distinguished on the Math EOG will increase from 14% in May 2026 to 20% in May 2027.

ELA EOG scores have not been released so a specific goal could not be developed based on EOG scores. The percentage of 3rd-5th grade SWD students scoring as Developing learners or higher on the ELA EOG will increase from ____% on the Spring 2026 Assessment to ____% on the Spring 2027 Assessment. The percentage of 3rd-5th grade SWD students scoring as Developing learners or higher on the Math EOG will increase from 54% on the Spring 2026 Assessment to 64% on the Spring 2027 Assessment. The percentage of 3rd-5th grade ELL students scoring as Developing learners or higher on the ELA EOG will increase from ____ on the Spring 2026 Assessment to ____ on the Spring 2027 Assessment. The percentage of 3rd-5th grade ELL students scoring as Developing learners or higher on the Math EOG will increase from 65% on the Spring 2026 Assessment to 70% on the Spring 2027 Assessment

2. Our focus will be communication through CTLS, ParentVue, and provide oportunities to meet for conferences.
3. Provide individualized and adaptive reading support using a variety of reading programs.
4. Provide individualized and personalized mathematics support using IReady Learning software.

Brumby Families

Families can support student's math and Reading understanding by:

1. Utilizing strategies provided by the school in both reading and math to explore books and literacy skills as well as mathematical concepts with your child.
2. Helping your child develop a love of reading by reading the materials provided with them at home.
3. Ensuring your child frequently logs into IReady software to build conceptual understanding and procedural fluency.
4. School expectations will be supported at home as well.
5. Ensuring your child frequently logs into IReady software to build conceptual understanding and procedural fluency.
