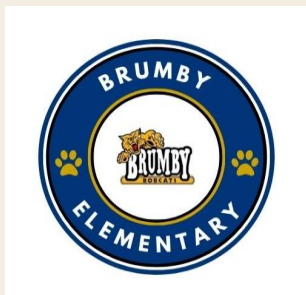

District Goals for Student Achievement

- By SY29, increase by 2percentage points the number of students performing at the proficient and distinguished lvels, as evidenced by state assessments.
- By SY29, increase graduation rate from 89% to 91% as measured by GaaDOE adjusted cohort graduation rate.

Brumby Elementary Goal(s) for Student Achievement

The average score of the staff and student GaDOE Climate Surveys will increase from 67.04 in SY25 to 72.0 in SY26.

- SY25 Staff – 67.18
- SY25 Student – 66.89

Kindergarten – 50% of kindergarten students will achieve an Amira ARM score of at least 1.0 by Spring 2027.

1st – grade students will grow from 40% of these students scoring an ARM score of at least 1.0 in Spring 2026 to 45% scoring above the cut scores (middle of Near Target (NT) range) on the ELA Beacon Assessment in May 2027.

2nd grade students scoring above the cut scores (middle of Near Target (NT) range) on the ELA Beacon Assessment will increase from 50% in May 2025 to 55%% in May 2027.

3. Ensuring your child frequently logs into iReady software to buiid conceptual understanding and procedural fiuency.
4. Read at least 20 minutes each night.
