District Goals for Student Achievement

- By SY26, increase growth by 2 percentage points, for students scoring at the proficient and distinguished levels, as evidenced by state assessments.
- By SY28, increase graduation rate from 87% to 88% as measured by GaDOE adjusted cohort graduation rate.

City View Elementary School Goal(s) for Student Achievement

- By May 2026, the percentage of students in grades 3–5 scoring at or above the Developing Learner (Level 2) on the Georgia Milestones ELA Assessment will increase from an average of 49.24% to 53%, as measured by the Spring 2026 Georgia Milestones End-of-Grade Assessment.
- By May 2026, the percentage of students in grades 3 - 5 scoring Proficient or Distinguished on the Georgia Milestones Math Assessment will increase from an average of 17.6% to 25%, as measured by the 2025 Georgia Milestones End-of-Grade Assessment.

Teachers, Parents, and Students-Together for Success

City View Teachers

City View teachers will provide parents with leveled readers and fluency passages readers to practice reading at home.

City View teachers will provide monthly newsletter to inform parents of the current learning standards, strategies and academic vocabulary for both reading and math.

City View teachers will provide parents with daily math practice homework sheets that correspond with grade level standards that have been taught.

City View Families

City View families will provide a quiet space and regular time for reading and ask students comprehension questions.

City View families will review the newsletter and the current grade level standards and academic vocabulary with their students.

City View families will provide quiet space and regular time for completing grade level appropriate math grade level standards based practice sheet.

City View Students

City View students read their leveled readers or fluency passages for 20 minutes and talk about it with their parents.

City View students will review the monthly newsletter with their parents.

City View students will complete their math practice sheets independently, show it to their parents, and return it to school.
