ASE – Academic Support and Enrichment

The first day of **ASE** (Academic Support and Enrichment) will be Wednesday, August 20. ASE occurs between 1st and 2nd periods every Monday, Wednesday, and Thursday. This is dedicated time for your student to receive remediation or extension in designated courses. Once scheduled, students will be able to see their ASE room location under Period 9 "Curriculum Advisement" in StudentVue. Students who don't have access to StudentVue will be assisted during the transition to ASE on Wednesday, August 20.

Expect Respect

On Tuesday, August 26th, we will begin *Expect Respect*, the district wide Bullying Prevention Program. This initiative, along with our class meetings, daily announcements, and handbook reviews, supports our commitment to fostering a school culture where all students feel safe and welcome, creating an optimal learning environment for our students.

We invite our families to help our students use the outlined steps to handle disrespectful words/actions by another student.



1. Tell the person to stop. 2. If they stop, move on with your day. 3. If the person does not stop, decide whether to ignore them or talk to an 4. If you ignore, don't look at or talk to that person. If you seek support, choose a trusted adult at school. If a student feels that they are encountering disrespectful words/actions, then they tell the person to stop. If the person does stop what they are doing, then the student can move on with their day. If the person doesn't stop what they are doing, then the student can decide to ignore them or talk to an adult. Students will appropriately respond if someone asks them to stop. If a student is told to stop, then they will: 1) stop what they are doing 2) remind themselves of the importance of making this change moving forward and 3) say "OK" to the request and move on with their day

Over the next few months, students will learn how to identify, stop, and report types of bullying behavior. The date and topic for our lessons are as follows:

- August 26 Introduction to "Expect Respect".
- September 2 Bullying Define, Identify and Report
- September 9 Racism/Hate Speech Define, Identify and Report
- September 16 Athletic events Good Sportsmanship and Spectator Behavior
- October 21 Cyber Bullying and Positive Online Presence
- November 11 Closing

We welcome our families to contact the school with any concerns about bullying behavior. We appreciate your ongoing support and discussions with your child as we work together to create a positive school community.
