Compton Elementary School Goal(s) for Student Achievement

<u>Goal #1:</u>

<u>K-2 Literacy Goal</u>-The percentage of students s coring "At or Above" Grade Level for grades K-2 will increase from 47% (146 students out of 312 students) to 53% (165 students out of 312 students) as measured by the 2024-2025 Spring Amira screening results.

<u>3-5 Literacy Goal-</u>The percentage of 3rd through 5th grade students scoring in the "Meets" Range will increase from 26% (71 students out of 268 students) to 33% (89 students out of 268 students) as measured by the 2024-2025 EOG ELA Assessment.

Goal #2:

<u>K-2 Math Goal</u>-The percentage of 1st and 2nd grade students scoring "Prepared" (per their quantile) will increase from 23% (51 students out of 218 students) to 29% (63 students out of 218 students) as measured by the 2024-2025 Spring Beacon Assessment.

<u>3-5 Math Goal</u>-The percentage of 3rd through 5th grade students scoring in the "Meets" Range will increase from 26% (70 stuents out of 271 students) to 32% (86 students out of 271 students) as measured by the 2024-2025 EOG Math Assessment.
