## **District Goals for Student Achievement**

- By SY26, increase growth by 2 percentage points, for students scoring at the proficient and distinguished levels, as evidenced by state assessments.
- By SY28, increase graduation rate from 87% to 88% as measured by GaDOE adjusted cohort graduation rate.

## South Cobb High School Goal(s) for Student Achievement

## Goal #1:

- By May 2026, 50% of students taking the 10<sup>th</sup>-grade EOC will read on or above grade level.
- By May 2026, increase the percentage of students in Biology scoring Proficient and Distinguished by 3% (approximately 245 students out of 541 students), as measuded by the EOC assessments.

#### Goal #2

 By May 2026, increase the percentage of students in Algebra scoring Proficient and Distinguished by 5% (approximately 190 students out of 541 students), as measured by the EOC assessments.

#### Goal #3

 By May 2026, increase the percentage f students in U.S. History scoring Proficient and Distinguished by 3% (approximately 180 students out of 420 tested) as measured by the EOC assessments.

 To increase the graduation rate by 3% from the 2024-25 school year to the end of the 2025-2026 school year.
