PSAT and College Board

Lassiter students are now able to access **PSAT scores** in their College Board accounts. A student's PSAT score can be useful in many ways. It gives valuable practice for the SAT and insight into how to prepare, and it opens opportunities for scholarships and recognition. PSAT scores serve as the initial screen for the National Merit Program and are automatically sent to National Merit Scholarship Corporation.

Students who take the PSAT see grade-level benchmarks on their score reports. These benchmarks

represent the section scores on each assessment that students should meet or exceed to be considered on track for college and career readiness. If your student is meeting the grade-level benchmark for a section, please continue to encourage them to take rigorous courses in that area while at Lassiter. As a school, we saw our average SAT score increase from 1182 in 2024 to 1206 in 2025! Your

student may want more information on how to improve their PSAT/SAT score. They can use their PSAT score report to receive tailored resources from Khan Academy and develop a study plan. Khan Academy's digital SAT course content, developed in partnership with College Board, includes videos, articles, and worked examples designed to help students understand and experience the SAT Suite of Assessments. While Khan Academy's Digital SAT Prep is beneficial for skill practice, College Board's Bluebook app is useful for full-length practice tests.

We highly encourage all Lassiter students to download the **BigFuture Mobile App**. Students who provided their mobile number on test day can download the app and sign in to access scores and start exploring customized career possibilities, key information about scholarships and financial aid, and guidance to help plan for college.

S2S/Spring Scheduling Information

In preparation for the upcoming spring semester, we want to provide you with important information about the scheduling process at Lassiter. Semester 2 Scheduling (S2S) Day will take place during homeroom on Tuesday, November 18. S2S Day is an important part of the spring semester scheduling process and allows students to view and verify their spring semester schedule. Their spring semester courses will be based on the courses they took in the fall and the requirements for high school graduation. This will be the final opportunity for students to verify the accuracy of their schedule. We will use the information from S2S Day to adjust the master schedule and balance classes prior to the first day of classes. Because of this, we are unable to accommodate schedule changes once we return from the semester break.

We recommend that you review your student's schedule every semester to ensure their course selections align with their academic and career aspirations. Please reach out to your school counselor if you have any questions regarding course options, credit requirements, or postsecondary planning.
