Lindley Middle School Academic Goals

Goal 1-By the end of the 2025-2026 school year, 6th -8th grade students will increase their scores from levels 2-4 from 57.7% (484 students) to (502 students) 60.9 % as measured by the English Language Arts Georgia Milestones Assessment.

Goal 2-By the end of the 2025-2026 school year, 6th-8th-grade students will increase their levels 2-4 scores from 67% (572 Students) to 70% (600 Students), as measured by the Mathematics Georgia Milestones End-of-Grade Assessment.

Goal 3- By the end of the 2025-2026 school year, 8th-grade students will increase their levels 2 - 4 scores from 66.6% to 70% as measured by the Science Georgia Milestones Assessment. 6th- and 7th-grade students will increase by 5%, 6th grade from 67% to 70%, and 7th grade from 79% to 82%, based on summative assessment scores.

Goal 4- By the end of the 2025-2026 school year, 8th-grade students will increase their levels 2 - 4 scores from 70.5% to 73.5 % as measured by the Social Studies Georgia Milestones Assessment. 6th- and 7th-grade students will increase by 5%, 6th grade from 62% to 65%, and 7th grade from 81% to 84%, based on summative assessment scores.

What is it?

This is a plan that describes how Lindley Middle School will provide opportunities to improve family engagement to support student learning. Lindley Middle School values the contributions and involvement of families to establish an equal partnership for the common goal of improving student achievement. Jointly Developed

Lindley Middle School invites all parents to complete the Fall school improvement input survey/evaluation to provide suggestions on the school's Title I program. All parents are also invited to attend the Spring school improvement input meeting to revise this parental involvement policy, our school-parent compact, building staff capacity professional learning topics, and the parental involvement budget. Additionally, parent input and comments regarding this plan are welcome during the school year. The plan is posted on our school Web site for parents to view and submit feedback throughout the year. All parent feedback received during the year will be used to revise the plan for the next school year. We also distribute an annual survey that is posted online to ask parents for their suggestions on the plan and the use of the 1% reservation of funds for parental involvement. Parents can also give feedback during any parent meetings and activities during the school year.

Who is it for?

All students participating in the Title I, Part A program, and their parents and families, are encouraged and invited to fully participate in the opportunities described in this policy. Lindley Middle School will provide full opportunity for the participation of Neglected and Delinquent proxy parents, parents and families with limited English, parents with disabilities, and parents of migratory children.

Where is it available?

Every family will receive the plan during Parent-Teacher Conference week. It is also available on the school website and a copy is in the front office binder. Parents can also retrieve a copy of the plan in the Parent Resource Center. We will gladly mail the plan to you upon request.

What is Title I?

Lindley Middle School is identified as a school having a Schoolwide Title I program as part of Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). Title I is designed to support State and local school reform efforts tied to challenging state academic standards which reinforce and enhance efforts to improve teaching and learning for students. Title I programs must be based on effective means of improving student achievement and include strategies to support parental involvement. All Title I schools must jointly develop with all parents a written parental involvement policy.

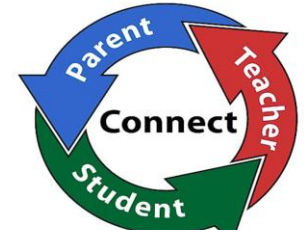
2025-2026 Cobb County Schools District Goals

Lindley Middle School will take the following measures to promote and support parents as an important foundation of the school in order to strengthen student academic performance and reach our school goals. We will:

- ✓ Ensure that all information related to school and parent programs, meetings, and other activities is published in both English and Spanish, posted on the school website, and included in the message for all parents.
- ✓ Provide two trainings each semester for staff during their planning periods on strategies to improve communication with parents and ideas to increase family engagement.
- ✓ Partner with our feeder schools by conducting joint meetings and events for parents and sending school information about parent engagement activities to help prepare parents and their child for school transitions.
