District Goals for Student Achievement

Increase student performance in all core content areas by 2% annually as measured by achievement data.

CCSD will increase the participation rate of families and communities engaging in services/programs by 10% as measured by CTLS Parent data, survey results & web view module.

By 2024, we will implement the PL framework to meet the needs of schools to ensure alignment with Superintendent Priorities as measured by PL opportunities, surveys, and student achievement.

By the end of 2025 school year every school will have identified practices and resources that support student success as measured by student academic, perception or discipline data.

Riverside Elementary Goal(s) for Student Achievement

Goal #1: By the end of May 2024, 50% of students in grades K-5 will score at the proficient level or higher in reading as measured by the RI (Reading Inventory) for grades K-5.

Goal #2: By the end of May 2024, 55% of students will score at the proficient level or higher on the writing assessment as measure by the Writing Rubrics from Lucy Calkins (K-2) or the Georgia Department of Education Milestones Writing Rubrics (3-5).

Goal #3: By the end of May 2024, 50% of the students in grades K-5 will score at proficient level or higher in Math as measured by the MI (Math Inventory).

Teachers, Parents, and Students-Together for Success

Riverside Teachers

Provide students/parents with phonics, reading, and web resources to improve reading. Provide access to Headsprout and/or Imagine Learning for each student.

Provide families with math resources, manipulatives and web resources to support math proficiency. Provide access to Dreambox for each student.

Offer Title 1 virtual and face to face events. Riverside will offer Literacy and Math Night, and Parent workshops that concentrate on strategies to increase academic achievement.

Riverside Families

Parents/Families will ensure daily independent reading/writing practice and ensure their child logs into Headsprout and/or Imagine Learning weekly to improve reading comprehension.

Families will ensure math resources and manipulatives are used for daily practice to help students solve math problem and make sure students log into Dreambox weekly.

Families will attend at least 1 Title I event per school year, or get information from the parent engagement coach, academic coaches or their child's teacher to help support their child's academic achievement.

Riverside Students

The students will read daily and use self-monitoring strategies with the support of the family to Improve reading comprehension.

The students will share examples of math strategies learned in class with parents and log into Dreambox for independent math practice.

The students will bring home class newsletters and notices about school events. Students will practice with their family strategies and activities that were learned at the event to increase academic achievement.
