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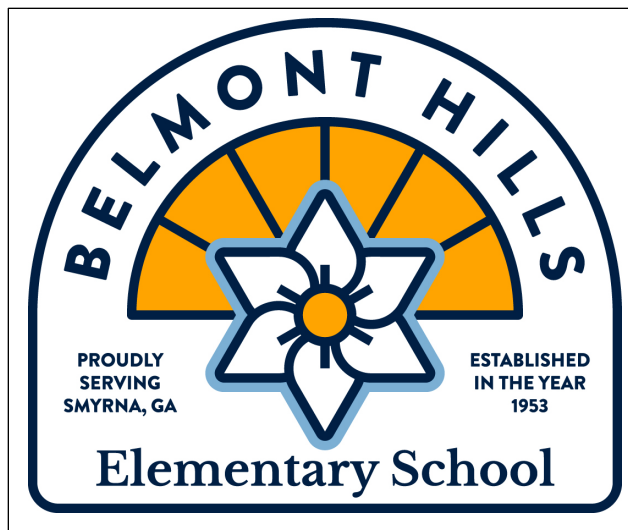

District Goals for Student Achievement

- Increase student performance in all core content areas by 2% annually as measured by achievement data.
- CCSD will increase the participation rate of families and communities engaging in services/programs by 10% as measured by CLTS Parent data, survey results & web view module.
- By 2024, we will implement the professional learning framework to meet the needs of all students to ensure alignment with the superintendent priorities as measured by professional learning opportunities, surveys, and student achievement.
- By the end of the 2025 school year, every school will have identified practices and resources that support student success as measured by student achievement, perception and discipline data.

Belmont Hills Elementary Goal(s) for Student Achievement

Goal #1: By May 2024 All kindergarten students will be proficient on the Amira, 1st grade will improve from 9 students to at least 18 students to reach a 190-530 Lexile band on the RI, 2nd grade will improve from 9 students to at least 24 students to reach a 420-650 Lexile band on the RI, 3rd grade will improve from 18 students to at least 30 students to reach a 530-820 Lexile band on the RI, 4th grade will improve from 20 students to at least 30 students to reach a 740-940 Lexile band on the RI, and 5th grade will improve from 20 students to at least 32 students to reach an 830-1010 Lexile band on the RI. Focus: Phonics and comprehension

Goal #2: By May 2024, Kindergarten will improve from 25 students to at least 30 students to reach a 9-117 quantile band on the MI, 1st grade will improve from 25 students to at least 37 students to reach a 117-232 quantile band on the MI, 3rd grade will improve from 20 students to at least 32 students to reach a 381-545 quantile band on the MI, 4th grade will improve from 27 students to at least 33 students to reach a 534-629 quantile band on the MI, and 5th grade will improve from 23 students to at least 32 students to reach a 645-771 quantile band on the MI. Focus: Number sense and computation

Teachers, Parents, and Students-Together for Success

Belmont Hills Elementary Teachers

Teachers will work with students and their families to support students' success in reading. Some of our key connections with families will be:

1. Provide parent with high frequency sight words in monthly newsletters for parent to use at home with students.
2. Send home information about how to choose a "just right" book for students to read with parents. **Kindergarten only** – Teachers will provide parents with appropriate leveled books to read with their children.
3. Provide a weekly take home reader for parents to practice with students.

Belmont Hills Elementary Families

Families can support students' success in reading by:

1. Practice sight words sent home monthly and recognize them in everyday tasks.
2. Learn how to identify "just right" books for my child. **Kindergarten only** – Parents will provide opportunities for children to read appropriate leveled books to them.
3. Parents read with their child for at least 20 minutes every night using the take home reader, or "just right" book, and discuss what was read.

Belmont Hills Elementary Students

Students thought of the following ideas to make connections between learning at home and school:

1. Practice sight words at home with parents.
2. Read independently at home for 20 minutes a night with a "just right" book, and discuss with parents what was read. **Kindergarten only** – Students will read appropriate leveled books to parents daily.
3. Read the weekly take home reader with parents.
