Step 1: Take an Interest Inventory – Available on Naviance or the following sites:

- Sign up to take the ASVAB (Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery) at Allatoona. It can be used for the military or for insight into your career strengths. (Scores are not automatically released to the military).

Step 2: Once you have your results, make a list of careers you want to research.

Step 3: Determine the occupational outlook for the career(s).

Step 4: Look for schools/programs that offer the major/training for that career. Use sites in Step 1 to search!

What type of training do you need to achieve your career goals?

On-The-Job Training	Structured hands-on training by a peer or supervisor over a short period of time. These careers don't typically require tests for certification or licensure.
Apprenticeship	Typically takes 1-6 years to learn the job from someone who is licensed in the field. Often requires formal licensure and may also require classes to learn the skills and prepare for the exam. Receive pay and benefits while training.
Military	Full-Time (Active Duty) or Part-Time (Reserves) Air Force, Army, Army National Guard, Coast Guard, Marines, Navy
Specialty School	Offer training in a specific career area. Note: They can be expensive. Financial Aid may be limited.
Technical College	State technical colleges that allow you to earn certificates, diplomas, or associate degrees in multiple career fields.
Four-Year College	Earn a bachelor's degree in multiple career fields.

Test Optional? What Does That Really Mean?

While some colleges and universities are test-optional, many are now requiring standardized test scores again. Don't assume—**do your research!** Check each school's admissions requirements carefully to find out if submitting SAT or ACT scores is necessary for your application.

Test scores will continue to be required to apply for Zell Miller scholarships in accordance with State of Georgia requirements.

HOW TO REQUEST YOUR TRANSCRIPT (2 STEP PROCESS)

NOTE: It is the Student's Responsibility to Complete Steps 1 & 2, or the Transcript will NOT be Sent.

STEP 1: Login to NAVIANCE STUDENT

1. At the top of the main page, click on **"Colleges"** and then, from the drop-down under "Apply to College," click "Colleges I'm applying to."
2. Click on the **blue circle with the plus sign** (far right-hand side).
3. **Choose your college, the application type (deadline you are planning to apply by) and how you will apply (Common App, Direct to Institution, etc.).** The application type is very important. If you don't choose correctly, we can't release your transcript.
 - a. For Common App documents, you must "Match" your Common App (see directions below).
4. Select whether you would like to submit SAT or ACT scores as part of your application.
 - a. **NOTE: Some schools require this!** If you are applying to a school that requires SAT or ACT scores, you **MUST** send your scores through the testing agency.
5. Then, choose **Add Application**. You will do this for each school you want to send a transcript to.

STEP 2: Go to the Counseling Office

1. Complete a Transcript Request Form
2. Pay \$2 per transcript (cash or check **ONLY**)

MATCHING YOUR COMMON APPLICATION IN NAVIANCE

ONLY if you are applying using Common App

Do Not Request Letters of Rec Through the Common App!

1. Login to NAVIANCE (**It won't work if you GOOGLE Naviance!**)
2. At the top of the main page, click on **"Colleges"** and then, from the drop-down under "Apply to College," click "Colleges I'm applying to."
3. Click on the pink square on the right that says, "Match Accounts." You will then be taken to the Common App website.
4. After you have been taken to the Common App website, enter your Email address and Password. Please enter the same email address you used for your Common Application. You will then be taken back to Naviance.

NOTE: Steps 1-4 above explain what you need to do in Naviance to match your Common App. You must also complete the following steps in your Common App account:

- ▶ Complete the Education section of your Common Application
- ▶ Add at least one college to the My Colleges tab
- ▶ Sign the FERPA Release Authorization

WAIVING FERPA rights (FEDERAL EDUCATIONAL RIGHTS AND PRIVACY ACT)

- **What is FERPA?** FERPA regulates the privacy of student education records, which could include your application to the college where you enroll. FERPA also gives you the right to review confidential letters of recommendation provided as part of that application after you enroll.
- **Should you waive your rights on your college application?**
 - Waiving your right lets colleges know that you do not intend to read your recommendations, which helps reassure colleges that the letters are candid and truthful.
 - Some recommenders may decline to write a letter for you if you do not waive your rights. Check with your counselor or teachers to see if any of them follow such a policy.

REQUESTING A LETTER OF RECOMMENDATION

1. **REQUIRED:** Complete the **Senior Survey Class of 2026** in Naviance.
 - a. Click on the About Me tab on the top of the Naviance Homepage.
 - b. Scroll down to **Surveys** and select **Surveys from Your School**. Then, click **“2026 Senior Survey”**
 - c. Complete each section. This will allow your teacher/counselor to write a personalized letter of recommendation. Remember to click save every thirty minutes or so because this page times out .
2. **OPTIONAL:** Create a resume using the **Resume Builder** in Naviance. If you already have a resume, you can email it to your counselor.

HOW TO REQUEST A COUNSELOR RECOMMENDATION

1. Complete the required documents above.
2. Indicate that your school requires a letter of recommendation/school evaluation on the Transcript Request form in the Counseling Office

HOW TO REQUEST A TEACHER RECOMMENDATION

Remember you should always ask if the teacher will write you a letter before you send a request!

1. Login to Naviance.
2. On the **Home page**, go to **Colleges**, then **Apply to College** and choose **Letters of Recommendation**.
3. Choose **Add Request**
4. Then, click on the drop down and **select the teacher** you would like to write your letter.
5. Next, **choose the school** that needs the letter.
6. **Include a personal note** to the teacher.
7. After you have submitted your request in Naviance, **follow up with the teacher a day or two later** to make sure they received the electronic request. It may have gone to their junk mail.

Hope Scholarship Programs

Hope Scholarship

- Georgia Graduate with a minimum 3.0 HOPE GPA as calculated by the Georgia Student Finance Commission (GSFC).
- Must earn a minimum of 4 full rigor credits from the academic rigor course list prior to graduating from high school. **You can also review the HOPE Rigor Required Course Listing here:**

- Must graduate from a GA high school.
- Must be a GA resident for at least one year.
- Which courses are weighted for HOPE?
 - Honors courses do not earn additional quality points toward the HOPE GPA
 - AP, IB, and Dual Enrollment core courses earn .5 additional quality points, up to a 4.0
- Review **your** HOPE transcript on **GAfutures.org**.

Zell Miller Scholarship

- Requires 3.7 core high school (HOPE) GPA as calculated by GSFC (www.gafutures.org).
- Currently requires a 1200 SAT Math and Reading or a 25 ACT composite in one test sitting
- Must earn a minimum of 4 credits from the academic rigor course list prior to graduating from high school.
- Pays 100% tuition for a two year or four-year degree.
- Must graduate from a GA high school.
- Must be GA resident for at least one year (Green Card or citizenship).
- Must maintain 3.3 in college. Student can drop to HOPE if GPA is lower than 3.3.

Hope Grant

- No initial GPA requirement; 2.0 required after the first 30 hours.
- Technical certificate or diploma.
- Must have a high school diploma or GED.
- Must be a GA resident for at least one year (Green Card or citizenship).
- Covers a percentage of tuition.

Zell Miller Grant

- No initial GPA Requirement; Requires 3.5 *college* GPA for grant eligibility.
- Does not require minimum test score.
- Covers 100% tuition (retroactively covers previous semester once 3.5 GPA is earned) for certificate or diploma at technical college.
- Must graduate from a GA high school.
- Must be GA Resident for at least one year (Green Card or citizenship).

Hope Career Grant

- Enroll in certain high-demand certificate and diploma programs at a University System of Georgia (USG) or Technical College System of Georgia (TCSG) school.
- HOPE Grant and Zell Miller Grant eligibility requirements apply.
- Award amount: Awards are a fixed amount per term based on the program and number of hours enrolled; approved programs and award amounts available on GAfutures.org.
 - Example 9 or more credit hours – \$500/semester
 - 3-8 credit hours – \$250/semester
 - 1-2 credit hours – \$125/semester
