### **LaBelle Elementary Goal(s) for Student Achievement**

By the end of the 2023-2024 school year, K students will be proficient on the AMIRA Assessment. For Grade 1, the percentage of students scoring proficient or advanced on the reading inventory (RI) will increase from 4% (3 students) on the May 2023 administration to a minimum of 40% (29 students) on the May 2024 administration. For Grade 2, the percentage of students scoring proficient or advanced on the RI will increase from 32% (19 students) on the May 2023 administration to a minimum of 49% (15 students) on the May 2024 administration. For K-5, the percentage of students scoring proficient or advanced on the math inventory will increase from 57% (203 students) on the May 2023 administration to a minimum of 72% (253 students) on the May 2024 administration.

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# Teachers, Parents, and Students-Together for Success

## LaBelle Elementary Teachers

In K and 1<sup>st</sup> grades, set a sight-word goal aligned with Cobb County standards and send home materials to help parents support the Sight Word reading goal.

In all grades, provide take-home books on the students' level or a phonics-decodable passage. The book may be in paper or digital format.

Provide parents with strategies for developing reading fluency at home.

Send home math materials like a number line, part-part-whole mat, and ten frames to help with building counting fluency.

## LaBelle Elementary Families

In K and 1<sup>st</sup> grades, practice sight words with my child three times a week for 10 minutes.

Read nightly with my child for at least 10 minutes, increasing to at least 20 minutes by 2<sup>nd</sup> grade.

For K students, listen to my child count as high as they can.

## LaBelle Elementary Students

Read daily.

Practice sight words to make sure I can reach my sight word goals.

Count as high as I can to an adult.

For K-5, the percentage of students scoring proficient or advanced on the math inventory (MI) will increase from 57% (203 students) on the May 2023 administration to a minimum of 72% (253 students) on the May 2024 administration.

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# Teachers, Parents, and Students-Together for Success

## LaBelle Elementary Teachers

Provide parents with a weekly update on learning topics and special events each week.

Provide parents with materials to assist with math fact fluency & reading comprehension strategies to practice at home.

Introduce, instruct, and assign online resources such as Raz Kids, DreamBox, ReadWords, and Studies Weekly.

## LaBelle Elementary Families

Use the materials sent home to practice reading regularly with my child and help them to record what they are reading.

Dedicate time daily to check CTLS for updates, announcements, etc.

Dedicate 5-10 minutes daily to assist my child with math fact fluency.

Assist and support my child with the online resources such as Raz Kids, DreamBox, ReadWorks, and Studies Weekly.

## LaBelle Elementary Students

Read daily and keep a log of what I am reading at home. I will include a short written response of what I have read.

Use the materials provided to practice multiplication facts for numbers 0-9 to improve my fluency.

Complete assignments and assessments using online resources such as Raz Kids, DreamBox, ReadWorks and Studies Weekly.

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For Grade 4, the percentage of students scoring proficient or advanced on the reading inventory (RI) will increase from 40% (22 students) on the May 2023 administration to a minimum of 58% (32 students) on the May 2024 administration.

For K-5, the percentage of students scoring proficient or advanced on the math inventory (MI) will increase from 57% (203 students) on the May 2023 administration to a minimum of 72% (253 students) on the May 2024 administration.

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### LaBelle Elementary Goal(s) for Student Achievement

For Grade 5, the percentage of students scoring proficient or advanced on the reading inventory will increase from 49% (28 students) on the May 2023 administration to a minimum of 67% (38 students) on the May 2024 administration.

## LaBelle Elementary Teachers

Provide parents with a math and reading roadmap that offers home strategies for helping their child.

Provide web-based reading resources such as Raz-Kids and Readworks for e-books so that students can practice summarizing reading strategies to show comprehension of text.
