District Goals for Student Achievement

- By SY26, increase growth by two(2) percentage points, for students scoring at the proficient or distinguished levels, as evidenced by state assessments.
- By SY28, increase graduation rate from 87% to 88%, as measured by GaDOE adjusted cohort graduation rate.

LaBelle Elementary's Goal(s) for Student Achievement

By May 2025, the percentage of 3rd grade students scoring proficient or advanced on the ELA Milestones will increase from 16% (10 students) to 33% (20 students). In 4th grade, the percentage scoring proficient or advanced on ELA section will increase from 23% (14 students) to 39% (24 students), and from 18% (10 students) to 29% (16 students) among 5th grade students.

On the Math Milestones, the percentage of 3rd grade students scoring proficient or advanced will increase from 16% (10 students) to 33% (20 students). In 4th grade, the percentage scoring proficient or advanced will increase from 39% (23 students) to 51% (31 students), and from 18% (10 students) to 36% (20 students) among 5th graders.

LaBelle Teachers Will:

Introduce, instruct, and assign online resources according to student grade level.

Provide reading materials and a reading log suited to student reading level.

Provide parents with strategies and materials to assist their child at home with math fact fluency & reading comprehension.

All teachers will send parents weekly updates on learning topics and special events.

LaBelle Families Will:

Assist and support my child with the online resources provided by teachers.

Use the materials sent home to ensure my child reads & records what they read every night, or help my child with reading.

Regularly check CTLS platform for updates to support my child's academic progress at home.

Dedicate 5-10 minutes daily to assist my child with math fact fluency and/or math vocabulary according to their grade level.

LaBelle Students Will:

Complete online assignments and assessments according to my grade level.

Read daily and keep a log of what I am reading at home. When required, include a short written response of what I have read.

In third grade, use the materials provided to practice multiplication and division facts for numbers 0-9.

In 4th grade, use approved websites to practice reading and math by choosing activities that are just right for me.

In 5th grade, talk with my parent about any new strategies I am learning in reading and math.

Encourage my parents to check CTLS for announcements and messages from my teacher.
