- Increase student performance in all core content areas by 2% annually as measured by achievement data.

Teachers, Parents, and Students-Together for Success

City View Teachers

Provide families with paper and web resources for student use to improve reading comprehension and support.

Provide families with math resources, manipulatives, and web resources to support math proficiency. Provide access to Dreambox for each student.

Offer Title 1 virtual and face to face events. City View Curriculum Nights, Data Nights, and Parent Workshops that concentrate on strategies to increase academic achievement.

City View Families

Parents/Families will ensure daily independent reading practice to ensure their child's improvement on reading comprehension.

Families will use math resources and manipulatives provided when helping students with math problem-solving and ensuring students login weekly to Dreambox.

Will attend at least 1 Title 1 virtual or face to face event per school year, watch a webinar, or get information from the parent facilitator, academic coach, or their child's teacher.

City View Students

The students will use self-monitoring strategies with the support of the family to increase reading comprehension skills.

The students will share examples of math strategies learned in class with parents and log into Dreambox for independent math practice.

The students will bring home class newsletters and notices about school events and practice with family strategies and activities learned at the event that will increase academic achievement.
