District Goals for Student Achievement

- By SY26, increase growth by 2 percentage points, for students scoring at the proficient and distinguished levels, as evidenced by state assessments.
- By SY28, increase graduation rate from 87% to 88% as measured by GaDOE adjusted cohort graduation rate.

Clay- Harmony Leland Goal(s) for Student Achievement

Goal #1 ELA:

K-2 The percentage of students in grades K-2 scoring on or above grade level in reading will increase from 63% (302 students) to 72% (345 students) as measured by Amira. *(We grew 42 students in 24/25- we took 3% of 42 and added it to 42 and rounded to 45 students which is 72% of K-2 population)*

3-5 The percentage of students in grades 3-5 scoring proficient or above grade level in English Language Arts will increase from 35 % (168 students) to 38% (188) as measured by the 2025-2026 Milestones.

Goal #2 Math:

Grades K-2: The percentage of students in grades K-2 scoring near target or prepared in math will increase from 81% (382 students) to 85% (401 students) as measured by Beacon

Grades 3-5: The percentage of students in grades 3-5 scoring on or above grade level in math will increase from 43% (208 students) to 50% (242 students), as measured by the 2025 – 2026 Milestones.

CHL Teachers

CHL Teachers will implement daily differentiated small-group math instruction by tailoring lessons to meet the needs of individual students, using math manipulatives and explicitly teaching math vocabulary.

CHL Teachers will analyze and develop a deep understanding of math & ELA priority standards by unpacking each standard, developing common assessments and choosing consistent research-based strategies to teach each standard in weekly CCC meetings.

CHL Teachers will implement daily differentiated small-group reading instruction based on student needs in the areas of fluency, vocabulary, comprehension, phonics, and phonemic instruction during the small group segment of the 120-minute reading block daily.

CHL Families

CHL Families will utilize the ELA and Math Resources shared by teachers to support and practice concepts taught in classrooms.

CHL Families will stay informed of the learning targets and standards being covered each week by reading teacher's newsletters sent through CTLS weekly.

CHL Families will communicate academic concerns to teachers/staff in the area of English language arts and math.

CHL Students

CHL Students will consistently participate in instruction and practice math and ELA skills taught in whole and small group and practice these skills in and out of school.

CHL Students will seek help and guidance from teachers and staff by communicating needs and seeking clarity when needed.

CHL Students will show families all documents, homework and graded assignments sent home from the teacher each day.
