Teachers, Parents, and Students-Together for Success

Argyle Elementary Teachers

Teachers will send home "Weekly Strategy Spotlights" with reading and math tips and mini assignments families can complete with their child.

Argyle Elementary Families

Families will use the "Strategy Spotlight" to work on reading and math practice with their child.

Argyle Elementary Students

Students will complete the weekly Strategy Spotlight activity at home with a family member.

Teachers will share strategies or videos on CTLS to help families support key academic skills and test-taking strategies at home.

Families will try at least one of the teacher-shared strategies or tips from CTLS to support their child's learning.

Students will apply strategies practiced at home during classwork and assessments.

Teachers will offer "Family Data Chats" (virtual or in-person) to review student progress toward EOG goals, and share specific ways families can help at home.

Families will attend quarterly "Data Chats" to review their child's academic progress and how to help with EOG preparation.

Students will talk about their learning goals during quarterly Data Chats and reflect on their progress with their family and teacher.
