### 2025-2026 CCSD District Goals

- By SY26, increase growth by 2 percentage points, for students scoring at the proficient and distinguished levels, as evidenced by state assessments.
- by SY28, increase graduation rate from 87% to 88% as measured by GaDOE adjusted cohort graduation rate.

### **Argyle Elementary Goal(s) for Student Achievement**

K-2 Literacy Goal: ELA K-2 Literacy Goal: The percent of 1st – 2nd grade students scoring within the "Prepared" range will increase from 33% (33 students) to 40% (40 students) as measured by the 2025-2026 Spring Lexile proficiency from the Beacon assessment

K-2 Math Goal: The percent of 1st – 2nd grade students scoring within the "Prepared" range will increase from 18% (27 students) to 25% (38 students) as measured by the 2025-2026 Spring administration of the Beacon assessment.

## *Teachers, Parents, and Students-Together for Success*

### **Argyle Elementary Teachers**

Teachers will send home a "Family Fluency Folder" each week with sight words, short reading passages, and hands-on math games for families and students to use together.

Teachers will share simple strategies or short videos on CTLS Parent to help families support reading and math skills at home.

Teachers will host quarterly check-ins (in-person or virtual) with families to review progress and set simple goals.

### **Argyle Elementary Families**

Families will use the "Family Fluency Folder" to help their child practice reading and math at home at least 10 minutes a day.

Families will try at least one of the strategies or activities shared by the teacher each week.

Families will attend (or join virtually) quarterly check-ins to talk about their child's growth and how to support learning at home.

### **Argyle Elementary Students**

Students will practice reading sight words, short texts, and doing math games at home with a family member.

Students will use strategies they practiced at home to help them during lessons and classroom activities.

Students will talk about their learning progress and set new goals each quarter with help from their teacher and family.
