District Goals for Student Achievement

- By SY26 , increase growth by 2 percentage points, for students scoring at the proficient and distinguished levels, as evidenced by state assessments.
- By SY28, increase graduation rate from 87% to 88% as measured by GaDOE adjusted cohort graduation rate.

Belmont Hills Elementary Goals for Student Achievement

Goal #1:

The percentage of 3rd - 5th grade students scoring proficient and distinguished in ELA will increase from 17% to at least 20% as measured by the 2025 –2026 Milestone EOG ELA Assessment.

Goal #2:

The percentage of 3rd - 5th grade students scoring proficient and distinguished in Math will increase from 31% to at least 34% as measured by the 2025-2026 Milestone EOG Math Assessment.

Teachers, Parents, and Students-Together for Success

Teachers. Belmont Hills Elementary Teachers will work with students and their families to develop students' love of learning. The focus of our key connections with families will be:

1. Teachers will provide parents with vocabulary words to practice at home.
2. Teachers will provide parents with resources for facts fluency so that students can practice math facts at home.
3. Teachers will provide a weekly CTLS post for parents about upcoming learning.

At Home. Belmont Hills Elementary Parents joined staff to develop ideas about how families can support students' academic understanding. Families may have other ideas to add to the list:

1. Parents will listen to their child practice vocabulary words and recognize them in everyday tasks.
2. Parents will help students practice math facts at home.
3. Parents will review the weekly CTLS post, and be given the opportunity to ask questions to support their child at home.
