District Goals for Student Achievement

- By SY26, increase growth by 2 percentage points, for students scoring at the proficient and distinguished levels, as evidenced by state assessments.
- By SY28, increase graduation rate from 87% to 88% as measured by GaDOE adjusted cohort graduation rate.

Belmont Hills Elementary Goals for Student Achievement

Goal #1:

The percentage of **Kindergarten** students demonstrating at/near or above grade level proficiency will increase from Fall 2025 to Spring 2026 by at least 80% as measured by the Amira in Spring 2026.

Students in **grades 1**st – **2**nd will increase their scale score by an average of 50 points from Fall 2025 to Spring 2026 as measured by the Beacon assessment.

Goal #2:

At least 80% of **Kindergarten** students will demonstrate proficiency by scoring 75% or higher in mathematics as measured by the CCSD Evidence of Student Learning assessment by the end of each unit.

Students in **1**st – **2**nd **grade** will increase their scale score by an average of 80 points from Fall 2025 to Spring 2026 as measured by the Beacon assessment.

Teachers, Parents, and Students-Together for Success

Teachers. Belmont Hills Elementary Teachers will work with students and their families to develop students' love of learning. The focus of our key connections with families will be: At Home. Belmont Hills Elementary Parents joined staff to develop ideas about how families can support students' academic understanding. Families may have other ideas to add to the list: **Students.** Belmont Hills Elementary Students thought of the following ideas to make connections between learning at home and school:

- 1. Teachers will provide parents with decodable passages to read with their children.
- Parents will listen their child to read decodable passages to them ask questions about what they read.
- 1. Students will read independently at home for 20 minutes a night with a decodable passages, and discuss with parents what was read.

- 2. Teachers will provide parents with resources for facts fluency so that students can practice math facts at home.
- 2. Parents will help students practice math facts at home.
- 2. Students will practice math facts at home.

- Teachers will provide a weekly CTLS post for parents about upcoming learning.
- Parents will review the weekly CTLS post, and be given the opportunity to ask questions to support their child at home.
- 3. Students will read the weekly CTLS post with parents.
