Osborne High School Academic Goals

<u>Goal #1:</u> By May 2027, the graduation rate of the FY27 cohort will increase from our current 74.33% to 78.39%.

<u>Goal #2:</u> The total percentage of students scoring proficient or distinguished on the Georgia Milestones Algebra EOC will increase from 18.1% to 21.1%.

<u>Goal #3:</u> Students scoring proficient plus advanced on the CCRPI English II EOC will increase from 26% to 29% (3% increase). Our goal is for 240 (826 approximate 10th graders) students to be proficient plus advanced by May 2026.

School Plan for Shared Student Achievement

What is it?

This is a plan that describes how Osborne High School will provide opportunities to improve family engagement to support student learning. Osborne values the contributions and involvement of families to establish an equal partnership for the common goal of improving student achievement. Jointly Developed

Osborne High School invites all parents to complete the Fall school improvement input survey/evaluation to provide suggestions on the school's Title I program. Additionally, parent input and comments regarding this plan are welcome during the school year. The plan is posted on our school Web site for parents to view and submit feedback throughout the year. All parent feedback received during the year will be used to revise the plan for the next school year. We also distribute an annual survey that is posted online to ask parents for their suggestions on the plan and the use of the 1% reservation of funds for parental involvement. Parents can also give feedback during any parent meetings and activities during the school year.

Who is it for?

All students participating in the Title I, Part A program, and their parents and families, are encouraged and invited to fully participate in the opportunities described in this policy. Osborne will provide full opportunity for the participation of Neglected and Delinquent proxy parents, parents and families with limited English, parents with disabilities, and parents of migratory children.

Where is it available?

Every family will receive the plan during the first semester via CTLS. It is also available on the school website and a copy is in the front office binder. Parents can also retrieve a copy of the plan in the Parent Resource Center. We will gladly mail the plan to you upon request.

What is Title I?

Osborne High School is identified as a school having a Schoolwide Title I program as part of the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). Title I is designed to support State and local school reform efforts tied to challenging state academic standards which reinforce and enhance efforts to improve teaching and learning for students. Title I programs must be based on effective means of improving student achievement and include strategies to support parental involvement. All Title I schools must jointly develop with all parents a written parental involvement policy.

- By SY26, increase growth by 2 percentage points, for students scoring at the proficient and distinguished levels, as evidenced by state assessments.
- By SY28, increase graduation rate from 87% to 88% as measured by GaDOE adjusted cohort graduation rate.
