District Goals for Student Achievement

- By SY26, increase growth by two percentage points, for students scoring at the proficient and distinguished levels, as evidenced by state assessments.
- By SY28, increase graduation rate from 87% to 88% as measured by GaDOE adjusted cohort graduation rate.

LaBelle Elementary's Goal(s) for Student Achievement

ELA Goal

The percentage of Kindergarten students scoring Demonstrating on the Constructing Texts domain of the GKIDS assessment will increase from 62% in May 2025 to 65% in May 2026.

The percentage of 1st grade students scoring above 500 on the language domain of the Beacon Assessment will increase from 39% in May 2025 to 42% in May 2026.

The percentage of 2nd grade students scoring above 520 on the language domain of the Beacon Assessment will increase from 37% in May 2025 to 40% in May 2026.

Math Goal

The percentage of Kindergarten students scoring 480 on the numerical reasoning domain of the Beacon assessment will increase from 23% in May 2025 to 26% in May 2026.

The percentage of 1st grade students scoring above 500 on the numerical reasoning domain of the Beacon Assessment will increase from 34% in May 2025 to 37% in May 2026.

The percentage of 2nd grade students scoring above 520 on the numerical reasoning domain of the Beacon Assessment will increase from 36% in May 2025 to 39% in May 2026.

Teachers, Parents, and Students-Together for Success

LaBelle Teachers Will:

Will send home materials to help parents support the phonics reading goal in K-2nd grade.

Send home materials like a number line, part-part whole mat, and ten frames to support counting fluency. In addion, provide parents with strategies to support addition and subtraction practice at home.

Provide take-home books on the students' level or a phonics-decodable passage to support reading fluency. The book may be in paper or digital format. In addition, provide parents with strategies to develop reading fluency at home.

Send weekly updates on learning topics and specials events via CTLS.

LaBelle Families Will:

Practice phonics words with my child three times a week for 10 minutes in K-2nd grade.

Read nightly with my child for at least 10 minutes, increasing to at least 20 minutes by 2nd grade.

For K-2nd grade students, listen to my child count as high as they canwith the goal of counting to 100 for K students and counting to 120 for 1st-2nd grade students. In addition, practice counting by 10s and counting backward from 20.

Check CTLS for posts and messages from my child's teacher.

LaBelle Students Will:

Read daily.

In Kindergarten, practice phonics words to make sure I can reach my phonics word goals and count as high as I can to an adult.

For 1st grade, practice counting, practice addition and subtraction facts within 20.

In 2nd grade, practice counting, use flashcards to practice my addition and subtraction facts with an adult.
