District Goals for Student Achievement

- By SY26, increase growth by 2 percentage points, for students scoring at the proficient and distinguished levels, as evidenced by state assessments.
- By SY28, increase graduation rate from 87% to 88% as measured by GaDOE adjusted cohort graduation rate.

Riverside Elementary Goal(s) for Student Achievement

Goal #1 -ELA-3-5: The percentage of third-fifth grade students scoring Level 3 or higher will increase from 16.1% (31 students) to 40% (77 students) on Milestones ELA Assessment by the end of the 2025-2026 school year.

Goal #2-MATH:3-5: The percent of 3rd through 5th Grade students scoring in the Proficient and/or Distinguished Learner Range will increase from 16% (31 students out of 191 students) to 32% (62 students out of 191 students) as measured by the 2025-2026 EOG Math Assessment..

Teachers, Parents, and Students-Together for Success

Riverside Elemementary Teachers

Teachers will provide parents with phonics skills being worked on in the classroom that can be reinforced at home.

Provide families with math resources, manipulatives and web resources to support math proficiency. Provide access to Dreambox for each student.

Offer Title 1 events focused on our school goals. Riverside will offer Literacy and Math Nights, and Parent workshops that concentrate on strategies to increase academic achievement.

Riverside Elementary Families

Families will practice weekly phonics skills with students at least 2-3 times per week.

Families will ensure math resources and manipulatives are used for daily practice to help students solve math problem and make sure students log into Dreambox weekly.

Families will attend at least 1 Title 1 event per school year, or get information from the parent engagement facilitator, academic coaches, or their child's teacher to help support their child's academic achievement.

Riverside Elementary Students

Students will participate in phonics lessons at school and review of skills at home.

The students will share examples of amth strategies learned in class with parents and log into Dreambox for independent math practice.

The students will bring home class newsletters and notices about school events. Students will practice with their family strategies and activities that were learned at the event to increase academic achievement.
