District Goals for Student Achievement

- By SY29, increase by 2 percentage points the number of students performing at the proficient and distinguished levels, as evidenced by state assessments.
- By SY29, increase graduation rate from 89% to 91% as measured by GaDOE adjusted cohort graduation rate.

Belmont Hills Elementary Goals for Student Achievement

Goal #1:

During the 26-27 school year, 40% (33/79) of **1st and 2nd grade students** will score Prepared in the Foundations domain on the Spring Beacon Assessment.

Goal #2:

At least 85% of **kindergarten students** will demonstrate Near Target and Prepared proficiency as measured by the 2027 Spring Beacon assessment.

Students in **grades 1st and 2nd** will increase their scale score by an average of 75 points from Fall 2026 to Spring 2027 as measured by the Beacon assessment.

Teachers, Parents, and Students-Together for Success

Teachers. Belmont Hills Elementary Kinder-2nd grade Teachers will work with students and their families to develop students' love of learning. The focus of our key connections with families will be:

1. Teachers will provide a reading passage aligned with wonders curriculum for parents to read with their children.

2. Teachers will provide parents with resources for number sense and fact fluency so that students can practice math at home.

3. Teachers will provide a weekly CTLS post for parents about upcoming learning.

At Home. Belmont Hills Elementary Kinder-2nd grade Parents joined staff to develop ideas about how families can support students' academic understanding. Families may have other ideas to add to the list:

1. Parents will listen to their child read the passages and children will answer questions about what they read.

2. Parents will help students practice math facts at home.

3. Parents will review the weekly CTLS post and be given the opportunity to ask questions to support their child at home.

Students. Belmont Hills Elementary Kinder-2nd grade Students thought of the following ideas to make connections between learning at home and school:

1. Students will read weekly passage at home each night, and discuss with parents what was read, and answer comprehension questions.

2. Students will practice math facts at home.

3. Students will read the weekly CTLS post with parents.
