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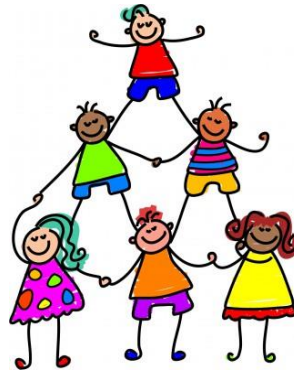

District Goals for Student Achievement

- By SY26, increase growth by 2 percentage points, for students scoring at the proficient and distinguished levels, as evidenced by state assessments.
- By SY28, increase graduation rate from 87% to 88% as measured by GaDOE adjusted cohort graduation rate.

Teachers, Parents, and Students-Together for Success

Hendricks Elementary Teachers

Send home resources to help strengthen fact fluency such as games, Freckle.com, Multiplication.com, and Math Parent Strategy guide to be used 2x a week for 10 minutes.

Send home resources to help with high frequency words, decoding, retelling and summarizing to be used 2x a week for 10 minutes.

Send home writing journals activities to have students describe characters, setting, and events responding to text 2x a week for 10 minutes.

Hendricks Elementary Families

Practice math facts with child to strengthen basic fact fluency using games and websites such as Freckle.com, Multiplication.com, and Math Parent Strategy guide 2x a week for 10 minutes.

Practice high frequency words, decoding, retelling, and summarizing using resources sent home to be used 2x a week for 10 minutes.

Practice writing activities with students asking them to describe characters, setting, an events responding to text they have read 2x a week for 10 minutes.

Hendricks Elementary Students

Use resources and strategies at home to continue to strengthen fact fluency such as Freckle.com, Multiplication.com and Math Parent Strategy guide 2x a week for 10 minutes.

Use resources and strategies at home to help learn high frequency words, decoding, retelling, summarizing 2x a week for 10 minutes.

Use writing journals to respond to text by describing characters, setting, and events 2x a week for 10 minutes.

School Goal(s) for Student Achievement

K - 2ND GRADE

ELA GOAL

Goal 1: By the end of SY 2024-25, the percentage of students in grades K-2 who are performing at the 50th percentile or above, will increase from 62% (156 out of 250 students) to 80% based on the Amira Universal Screener.

MATH GOAL

Goal 2: By the end of SY 2024-25, the percentage of students in first grade and second grade, who are proficient or above on quantile scores will increase from 25% (60 out of 239 students) to 50% based on the quantile score from the Math Beacon assessment.
