### **ELA Standards for Learning**

All Georgia schools use the adopted K–12 English Language Arts standards. These standards are designed to:

- Build strong reading, writing, listening, and speaking habits across all grade levels
- Help students make meaning from the texts they read, hear, and view
- Support students as they express their ideas through writing, speaking, and creating
- Promote deep understanding of how language works—from sounds and letters to sentences and stories

The standards emphasize the *connectedness* of all parts of literacy and are organized into four key areas: Foundations, Language, Texts, and Practices. More information on Georgia's K-12 English Language Arts (ELA) Standards can be found [here](#).

We will use Wonders and UFLI Foundations as our core resources to deliver a research-based, comprehensive curriculum that helps students:

- Build strong foundational skills like phonics, handwriting, and fluency

- Develop vocabulary and comprehension strategies
- Encourage academic conversations and writing based on reading

In class, your child will read, write, speak, and listen every day. Instruction is organized around sets of texts related to themes like friends, community, animals, and the earth.
