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Magnet Testing for Non-Cobb County Students

Registration Deadline: October 9, 2026

****Please note that once the registration deadline passes, we cannot add any more students****

Thank you for your interest in applying to one or more of the Cobb County Magnet Programs. **Non-Cobb County School District students (private school, homeschool, out of district) who have not taken the PSAT 8/9 should register to take this test as part of the magnet admissions process.** If you took the PSAT 8/9 at your school, please contact the magnet coordinators to find out how to properly submit your scores.

The PSAT 8/9 is a fully digital, computer-based assessment and will be administered at Kennesaw Mountain High School (1898 Kennesaw-Due West Road, Kennesaw, 30152) on **Saturday, October 17th**. Please arrive at Kennesaw Mountain High School at **7:15 am** to begin the check-in process. Check-in will conclude by 7:30 am. Students will need to bring their own, fully charged laptop (a PC or a Mac, no Chromebooks) for the test. Students must have downloaded and installed the Bluebook Testing Application from College Board ([Download the Bluebook Testing App](#)) on their computers prior to arriving for the test. A digital readiness check will be completed before testing begins. We expect that testing will be completed by 11:30 am.

Students must request testing accommodations directly through College Board. Information about how to request accommodations can be found here: [How to Request Accommodations](#). If a student has been granted accommodations for testing, please send official documentation to Andrew Kutscher at andrew.kutscher@cobbk12.org. Documentation of accommodations will be required at least one week prior to testing (by October 9th). Please click on the "Register" button and fill out the fields in the registration form accurately. **The cost of the exam is \$15.20.**

It is the student's responsibility to register to take the test. **Only students registered for the test, and that have started their magnet program application (opens October 1st) will be allowed to sit for the exam.** This test is the official PSAT 8/9 from College Board and is an important component of the Magnet application. Results will be reported directly to the student and will be sent to the Magnet Programs. If you have questions about the test, please contact one of the magnet coordinators or Andrew Kutscher in the Advanced Learning Office. Students must create an official college board account to be able to check their scores.

On the day of the test, bring your fully charged laptop, a power cord, a pencil or pen, an approved calculator (a graphing calculator is built into the app, but you can bring your own approved calculator if you like. [Approved calculators](#)), an external, plug-in mouse if you use one, and a **photo ID** (A valid school or government-issued photo ID or a **notarized College Board Student ID Form**). **Students will not be admitted without proper identification, or without having started their magnet application.** Cell phones and other devices that connect to the internet (smart watches, smart glasses) are not permitted in the testing rooms ([full list of prohibited items](#)). These items will be collected before testing and returned to students after the exam has finished.

Students must arrive at Kennesaw Mountain High School between 7:15 and 7:30 to get their seat assignments and perform a required digital readiness check. Testing will begin immediately after the digital readiness check, and we expect that testing will conclude by 11:30 am. No late arrivals will be permitted to test. If the Cobb County School District is closed for inclement weather, please check the magnet schools' websites for further information.
