1. **School Updates:** Mr. Perry began by thanking those in attendance. Tonight, was Eagle Chat with Principal Perry, Spring Open House and PAC, so we understand if some members were absent.

a. Testing Data

- i. EOC (End of Course) test is part of what is factored into CCRPI.
 1. 8% Gain in American Lit from FY23
 2. 21% Gain in U.S. History from FY23
 3. CCRPI score is also affected by state survey (encouraging staff, students, and families to complete)
- ii. New carpet in several classrooms as well as upgrades in the weight room.
- iii. Working with alumni and other sponsors on new LED marquee sign. (Estimated cost of \$66k)

b. New Gym Construction Update

- i. Gym construction is still underway, and they are making great progress! There is not an estimated date of completion, but they are on schedule. The gym being slightly away from the main portion of campus makes the building process much easier.

c. Upcoming Events

- i. **Lexiles and Literacy: 02/13:** We discuss all things reading and writing. We will discuss the RI (Reading Inventory) test, Lexile levels, and the school-wide initiative to improve our students reading and writing skills.
- ii. **Curriculum Night: 03/12:** Join the academic coaches and teaches for a hands-on experience in the classroom. Dinner will be served.
