#### **District Goals for Student Achievement**

- By SY26, increase growth by 2 percentage points, for students scoring at the proficient and distinguished levels, as evidenced by state assessments.
- By SY28, increase graduation rate from 87% to 88% as measured by GaDOE adjusted cohort graduation rate.

#### **Bryant Elementary Academic Goals**

The students scoring demonstrating or exceeding will increase by 10 percentage points from the August 2025 administration to the Ma 2026 administration of GKIDS (ELA section).

#### 1st-2nd Literacy Goal

The students scoring near target or prepared will increase from an average 10 percentage points (August 2024 Beacon ELA to May 2025) to 20 percentage points from August 2025 BEACON ELA assessment to May 2026 BEACON ELA assessment.

The percent of students scoring proficient and distinguished will increase from \_\_15% (62) to \_\_18% (67) as measured by the 2025-2026 EOG ELA Assessment.

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## Teachers, Parents, and Students-Together for Success

#### **Bryant Teachers Will:**

The Bryant Kindergarten -Second Grade Teachers will work with scholars and their families to develop students' academic achievement. The focus of our key connections with families will be:

- -Provide opportunities for scholars to practice retelling in daily guided reading groups, and send home leveled reading books for practice at home.
- -Give scholars multiple opportunities to practice letters and sounds daily in class with hands on and online activities through the Early Literacy Framework.
- -Provide scholars with a variety of objects to count and match to numbers, conduct guided math groups daily, and set up differentiated math stations to extend or remediate math standards.
- -Maximize instructional time throughout each day.

#### **Bryant Families Will:**

Parents and staff will work together to develop ideas about how families can support their scholar's reading, math and writing instruction by:

- -Read to and with scholar daily and have scholar retell story.
- -Practice letters and sounds with scholar daily.
- -Have scholar practice counting objects and recognize numbers around the house and in the community.
- -Ensure scholar arrives to school daily, on time, and is ready to learn.

### **Bryant Students Will:**

Parents, Staff and Scholars will develop ideas about how they can succeed in school and achieve in reading, writing, and math.

- -Read nightly with a parent, practice retelling in literacy stations and be accountable for completing assignments in scholar led literacy stations.
- -Participate in letter/sound literacy stations and engage in guided group activities.
- -Complete math assignments during guided groups with teacher and in independent math stations.
- -Come to school prepared and ready to learn each day.
